

Safety information

Important - Please read these instructions fully before use

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- Read all the instructions carefully before using the unit and keep them for future reference.
- The unit must be placed on a flat stable surface and should not be subjected to vibrations.
- Do not place the unit on sloped or unstable surfaces as the unit may fall off or tip over.
- The mains socket must be located near the unit and should be easily accessible.
- Avoid extreme degrees of temperature, either hot or cold. Place the unit well away from heat sources such as radiators or gas/electric fires. Avoid exposure to direct sunlight and other sources of heat.
- Never place any type of candle or naked flame on the top of or near the unit.
- To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock or product damage, do not expose this unit to rain, moisture, dripping or splashing. No objects filled with liquids, such as vases, should be placed on the unit.



Unpacking


Remove all items from the packaging. Retain the packaging. If you dispose of it, please do so according to local regulations.

Let's get started

Power connection

- 1. Plug the power cable into the socket on the back of the boombox and plug the mains power plug into the mains power wall socket and switch on.
- 2. Fully extend the telescopic radio aerial on the back of the Boombox to receive the best possible radio reception and sound quality.
- 3. Adjust the telescopic antenna to get good radio reception if need.

Inserting batteries (optional)

Before inserting the batteries (not included), please ensure that the Boombox is switched off (slide the On/Off switch at the back of the Boombox to 'Off') and is unplugged from the mains power supply.

- 1. Underneath the Boombox, press in the two battery compartment tabs and pull up to remove the battery compartment cover.
- 2. Insert 4 x 1.5V C-size (also known as LR-14 and UM-2) batteries, making sure to note the '+' and '-' markings and position the batteries the correct way around.
- 3. Replace the battery compartment cover, making sure that it 'clicks' home.

***Note:

When the battery power is low, you will notice that the audio quality will be a little distorted and the volume will be guieter. Please switch off the Boombox and replace the batteries.

Please turn the unit off completely to save energy when not in use.

General operation

- 1. Slide the On/Off switch at the back of the Boombox to 'On'. 'Welcome to Digital Radio' will be displayed and then your Boombox will go to Standby mode.
- 2. Press and release **@/MODE**. The first time you switch on your Boombox or if the station list is empty, your Boombox will automatically begin to scan for DAB radio stations. A progress bar will show the progress of the scan and the number of stations found during the scan will also be displayed.

When the scan is complete your Boombox will select the first available station and begin to play. Stations are listed in numerical and then alphabetical order by default.

Select Modes

Press and release ϕ -MODE to change between DAB radio, FM radio, and CD modes. Please check the display, which will confirm the mode.

Adjusting the volume

Press VOL+ / VOL- to increase the volume and decrease the volume.

***Note: Always keep the volume within reasonable limits.

System settings

Press and hold the INFO/MENU to access the menu and then press the

don' to select System and press ok/scan/№ into System Settings.

Let's get started

Set Time and Date

Press ◄ or ►► until <Time > is displayed. Press oK/SCAN/►II.
 Set Time/Date> is displayed. Press oK/SCAN/►II into Time/ Date setting.

2.Set Time

Press I◀ or ▶ to select hour/min/date/month/year, then press OK/SCAN/▶ to confirm and saved.

3.Update

Press ◄ or ► to select 'ANY' or 'DAB' or 'FM', or 'NO UPDATE', then

press **ok/scan/**▶II to confirm.

4.Set Date Format

Press

✓ or

to select 'DD-MM-YYYY' or 'MM-DD-YYYY', then press

OK/SCAN/►II to confirm.

5.Set 12/24 hours

Press ► or to select '12' or '24' then press ok/scan/II to confirm.

Alarm

Note: Check that the radio has the correct time and date before you set an alarm.

- 1. Press I◀ or ► to use Alarm 1 Setup or access Alarm 2 Setup, press the OK/SCAN/► to confirm.
- 2. Alarm 1 Wizard: The hour / Minute digits for the alarm will flash, press

 or → to choose hour and minute and press the OK/SCAN/→II to confirm.
- 3. Duration: from 15, 30, 45, 60, 90 mins, press ◄ or ► to choose and press the **OK/SCAN/►** to confirm.
- 4. Source: Buzzer, DAB, or FM, press I◀ or ►> to choose and press OK/SCAN/►II to confirm. When selecting Digital Radio or FM, the radio will play the station that was last listened to as the alarm.
- 5. Frequency: Daily, Weekdays, Weekends or Once, press I◀ or ►► to choose and press OK/SCAN/►II to confirm.
- 6. Alarm Off or On , press \bowtie or \bowtie to choose and press $ok/scan/\bowtie$ to confirm, then "Alarm Saved" display
- 7. Volume: 4-16, press I◀ or ►►I to choose and press OK/SCAN/FII to confirm, then "Alarm Saved" display

Note: Once the alarm sounds, press **oK/SCAN/MI** to delay the alarm for another 5 mins. The radio will go to Standby mode.

To cancel a sounding alarm, or an alarm in snooze, press 6/MODE.

Backlight:

The display brightness can be configured to your choosing, including dimming the brightness after a pre-determined time

1. Select Timeout to determine if the display brightness dims after a length of time. Press

In or ▶ to select from Off, 10 sec, 20 sec, 30 sec, 45 sec, 60 sec, 90 sec, 120 sec and 180 sec and press OK/SCAN/▶ to confirm.

Let's get started

- 2. Select On level to choose the display brightness during operation. Press ◄ or ▶ to select from "High", "Medium" or "Low" and press OK/SCAN/▶ to confirm.
- 3, Select Dim level to choose the display brightness after timeout. Press I◀ or ▶ to select from "High", "Medium", "Low" or "Off" and press OK/SCAN/▶II to confirm.

Factory reset:

Resetting the radio will delete all the tuned DAB stations and all the preset memory stations in FM and DAB modes, all alarm times, and other personalised settings. To reset the radio:


- 1. Press

 or

 to select "Factory Reset" and press oκ/scan/

 il to confirm.
- 2. The display will show "Factory Reset.? No or Yes." Press

 or ▶ to select Yes and press OK/SCAN/▶I to reset the radio.



Using your DAB + CD Boombox

Let's get started

DAB Radio Mode

Press **O**/MODE to switch to DAB mode.

Full scan

A full scan will automatically commence when the unit is first switched on. The unit will search for all available DAB stations.

To start a scan manually, select Menu > Full scan. Once the scan is completed, the radio will play the first station.

Manual tune

The manual tune menu option allows the user to select a particular channel and display the signal strength for that channel.

Display modes and station Information in DAB Mode

Press INFO/MENU repeatedly to show the different program information.

Time and Date: Displays the time and date information provided by the broadcaster. Dynamic Label Segment (DLS): Displays scrolling text information supplied by the broadcaster.

PTY (Program Type): Shows the type and description of the program provided by the DAB station.

Channel and Frequency: Displays the station's transmission channel number and frequency.

Signal Strength: Displays a signal bar with the strength of the current station.

Bit Error Rate (BER): Provides details of the signal error rate.

Bit Rate: The data rate at which the signal is being transmitted.

Pruning stations

When the DAB Radio has performed a scan in several locations you may find there are stored stations that you can no longer receive.

Press I or I to select Yes, then press OK/SCAN/I to confirm.

Dynamic Range Compression (DRC)

To change the DRC setting for DAB radio, press

or

to select High, Low or Off and press ok/scan/▶II to confirm.

Note: Radio DRC setting does not have any effect if DRC data is not included in the broadcast.

Preset / storing stations

You can store up to 30 DAB+ and 30 FM presets for quick and easy recall of your favourite stations.

1. To store a preset, you must first be listening to the station that you would like to save. Press and hold PRESET/■. The display will show "Preset Store < #:(Empty) >". You can select preset number (01 ~30) and press OK/SCAN/MI to confirm. The display will show "Preset # stored".

Using your DAB + CD Boombox

Let's get started

- 2. If you wish to overwrite a preset station; listen to the station you wish to save, then press and hold PRESET/■. Press Id or I to select the preset number you wish to overwrite.
- 3. Press **PRESET/** to display the stored list < #: Station name>.

Recalling stored stations

Once you have saved a station to one of the preset s, you can:

- 1. Press PRESET/■, "Preset Recall" is displayed together with the number of the current preset location.
- 2. Press ◄ or ► to move to your desired preset station's number.
- 3. Press ok/scan/№II to select a preset station number.

FM Radio Mode

Press (b/MODE to switch to FM mode

Auto scan

- 1. Press OK/SCAN/MI, this will start scanning up the frequency band.
- 2. Once the scan is completed, the radio will play the first station. And the stations will be stored in Preset.

Manual scan

To search FM stations manually, simply press

or → to fine tune each frequency in 0.05MHz steps if necessary.

Or press and hold **◄** or **▶** to scan up / down the frequency band.

Scan setting and audio setting

- 2. Audio Setting, press I◀ or ➤ to select Stereo allowed or Forced Mono. Press OK/SCAN/▶II to confirm.

FM display modes

This function allows information related to the current station to be shown in the display. Press INFO/MENU repeatedly to scroll through the following different information: RDS (scrolling text): the broadcaster to may included a scrolling text message about the current program. (If RDS is available)

Program type: this describes the type of the program being broadcasted. Audio mode: the display will show if the radio station being received station is with stereo or mono sound.

Time /Date: the time and date will automatically be updated by the radio time signal (If RDS is available)

Using your DAB + CD Boombox

Let's get started

CD Mode

Check that your Boombox is in CD mode. If you are not already in CD mode, briefly press and release **O/MODE** until you are in CD mode (check the display). The display will show 'CD-Reading', followed by 'NO DISC'. If the CD compartment is empty.

Play a CD

Note: It is not possible to play DVD or computer CDs.

1. Lift up the lid of the CD player on the front edge, where there is a scooped recess.
2. Place an audio CD, label side up, into the CD compartment. Please ensure that line up the hole in the centre of the CD, with the central spindle and press down into place.
3. Close the lid of the CD player. After a short delay the first track will begin to play. Track number and the elapsed time of the track will be displayed.

CD controls

You can use the following controls on your Boombox in CD mode.

• Play and Pause

Press **OK/SCAN/ÞI**. The first track will begin to play and the track number and the elapsed time of the track will be displayed. Then press **OK/SCAN/ÞI** again to Stop or continue to play the track/CD.

• Next track or Previous track:

Press I or ▶►I

Stop

Press **PRESET/** ...

Programmed play mode


In programmed play mode, you can program the play order of the tracks on your CD. You can program up to 20 tracks in total.

Note: To set up programmed play mode, the CD must be stopped in the CD compartment and must not be paused or playing.

In CD mode, with the CD you wish to programme in the CD compartment and stopped:

- 1. Press ${\tt PRESET/\blacksquare}$ to enter CD programmed play mode. 'MEM P01 T-001' will be displayed.
- 3. 'P02 T—00X' will now be displayed and you can select the second track that you would like to programme. Continue to select each track as in Step 2 above, up to a total of 20 tracks. Press PRESET/■ again to confirm the last track in the programmed play mode list. If you have programmed 20 tracks, 'MEM FULL' will be displayed.
- 4. Press ok/scan/№ to play the programmed tracks.
- 5. To exit programmed play mode, press **PRESET/** twice, then press **OK/SCAN/№I**.


