

# Safety information

**Important** - Please read these instructions fully before installing or operating

#### **Power source**

 Only use the USB cable that came with the product. Using an unauthorised cable will invalidate your guarantee and may irrecoverably damage the product.

## Battery safety - Handheld DAB Radio

- This Radio has a built in rechargeable battery (1050mAh) that cannot be replaced.
- Never try to dismantle the radio.
- Do not short-circuit the supply terminals.
- Dispose of the radio responsibly at local authority household waste recycling facility.
- DO NOT dispose of the radio in a fire as the battery may explode or leak.

#### Moisture and water


• Do not leave it in low temperatures as moisture can form inside the product, which may damage the circuit board.

To avoid possible hearing damage, do not listen to this radio at high volume levels for long periods of time. Always keep the volume within reasonable limits.



















#### 4. Select

- Press and release to Select/Confirm an option in the Menu










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#### 5. Menu

- Press and hold to display the Menu options
- Press and release to change the Radio information display

#### 6. Tune down

- Press and release to fine tune FM stations/move through the DAB station list or Menu options
- Press and hold to fast scan down the FM frequency band

#### 7. Tune up

- Press and release to fine tune FM stations/move through the DAB station list or Menu options
- Press and hold to fast scan up the FM frequency band
- 8. Micro USB charging port (under cover)
- 9. Headphone socket (under cover)
- 10. On/Off slide switch
- 11. Support stand
- 12. Telescopic antenna
- 13. Volume down
- 14. Volume up

## Charging the battery

- 1. Your Handheld DAB Radio has an integral rechargeable battery. Before you use your radio for the first time, you need to charge the battery, which will take approximately 5 hours from a full charge you will be able to listen to your radio continuously for approximately 10 hours.
- 2. Connect the micro USB end of the charging cable to the Micro USB socket on the left hand side of the Handheld DAB Radio (under the cover).
- **3.** Plug the standard end of the charging cable into a computer or other USB charging device. The radio display will switch on, 'Welcome to Digital Radio' will be displayed and then your radio will go to Standby mode with a clock display.
- **4.** Extend the telescopic aerial, this will ensure that the maximum signal strength is available when the radio begins to scan for stations.
- 5. Slide the Power switch on the right hand side of the product to On. Your radio will begin an automatic scan for DAB Radio stations. When the scan is complete, press and release the **Menu** button until the battery charge status is displayed.'

Note: If the battery is completely exhausted, you will need to wait a short while after it has been on charge, before the radio will power on and you are able to check the battery status information

6. When the Handheld DAB Radio battery is fully charged, 'Charge full' will be displayed.

## Adjusting the volume

Use the  $\odot$  and  $\odot$  buttons on the top of the radio to increase or decrease the volume. Press and hold the  $\odot$  or  $\odot$  button to progressively increase or decrease the volume.

Check the display, which will confirm the volume setting.

## Change the mode

Press and release the **Mode** button to change between DAB and FM modes. Please check the display, which will confirm the mode.

## Keylock

Press and hold the **Mode**/ button to turn the Keylock on or off.

## **Using headphones**

You can connect headphones with a 3.5mm plug (not included) to your radio. The headphone socket can be found on the left hand side of the radio underneath the cover. When you have headphones connected the radio speaker is switched off and all sound is via the headphones.

Note: Always keep the volume within reasonable limits.





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

#### **DAB Radio mode**

Check that your radio is in DAB mode. If you are not already in DAB mode, press and release the **Mode** button to go to DAB mode (check the display).

The first time you use the radio or if the station list is empty, your radio will automatically begin to scan for DAB radio stations. A progress bar will show the progress of the scan and the number of stations found during the scan will also be displayed.

When the scan is complete your radio will select the first available station and begin to play. Stations are listed in numerical and then alphabetical order by default.

If you were listening to a DAB station when you switched the radio off then this station will be automatically selected when you switch the radio back on.

## Telescopic aerial

Please make sure that the aerial is fully extended before you attempt to tune to a DAB station (a vertical position is recommended). This will ensure that the maximum signal strength is available when the radio begins to scan. Extending the aerial also ensures the best possible sound quality.

## **Changing DAB stations**

In DAB mode:

- 1. Press and release the ◀ or ▶ button to scroll through the available station list.
- When the station that you would like to listen to is highlighted press and release the Select button. There will be a short delay whilst your radio tunes to your selected station.

## **Scanning for DAB stations**

With DAB radio, additional stations and services regularly become available so it's a good idea to carry out a manual scan every now and then to make sure that you have the most up to date station listing stored within the memory of your radio. If you have moved your radio to another location e.g.: if you go on holiday, then it's also a good idea to carry out a manual scan.

If you are not already in DAB mode, press and release the **Mode** button to go to DAB mode

- 1. Press and hold the Menu button to enter the Menu options.
- 2. 'Full Scan' will be highlighted. Press and release the Select button to begin a search for stations. The display will change to 'Scanning...' A progress bar will show the progress of the scan and the number of stations found during the scan will also be displayed.

#### **Prune DAB stations**

You can remove the DAB stations in the station list that cannot be received in your area. These are listed with a '?' prefix.

In DAB mode:

- Press and hold the Menu button. Use the 

  or 

  button to scroll to 'Prune Invalid'.

  Press and release the Select button.
- 2. 'Proceed to prune the invalid stations?. 

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## Storing a DAB station preset

Your radio can store up to 20 DAB stations in its preset memories for instant access to your favourite stations.

Note: When you store DAB radio station presets, these do not overwrite your FM station presets.

- 1. Tune your radio to the station that you wish to preset (see changing DAB stations on page 18).
- 2. Press and hold the **Preset** button. 'Save to **Preset**' and a list of numbered preset locations is displayed (1-20).
- 3. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight the Preset location that you would like to store the radio station to (1-20).

**4.** Press and release the **Select** button, the display will confirm 'Preset X saved', where 'X' is the number of the preset (1-20).

Note: If there is already an existing DAB station stored under a preset, it will be overwritten when you store the new station.

## Tune to a DAB preset station

In DAB mode

- 1. Press and release the **Preset** button. '**Preset Recall**' and a list of numbered preset locations is displayed. The name or frequency of any stored stations is also displayed or '**(Empty)**' if no previous station has been stored.
- 2. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight the Preset location and station that you would like to listen to (1-20). Press and release the **Select** button. The radio will instantly tune to that station and begin to play.

Note: If no DAB station has been stored under the preset button, 'Preset Empty' will be displayed and the radio will revert to the previously selected radio station.

## DAB display information

When listening to a DAB station you can change the information that will appear on the display by pressing the Menu . There are several different types of information that are sent by the broadcaster.

- Dynamic Label Segment (DLS) This is scrolling text information supplied by the broadcaster. Information could be the name of an artist or music title, DJ's name, contact details for the radio station etc.
- Program Type (PTY) such as 'Rock', 'Pop', Talk' or 'News'
- Multiplex Name displays the broadcasting area and collection of radio stations on this frequency e.g.: BBC National DAB, Digital 1 Network.
- Time and date Supplied by the broadcaster.

Signal Strength and Signal error - An empty 
 will appear on the second line of the
 display to indicate the minimum signal strength for acceptable listening. The row of
 solid rectangles indicate the actual signal strength that you are receiving. The stronger
 the signal, the further to the right the row of solid rectangles will be.

The Signal error is displayed as a number between 0-99. It would not be possible to satisfactorily listen to a ratio station with a signal error rate of 30 or above. Try adjusting the aerial or relocating your radio to improve reception.

- Channel and Frequency e.g.: 12B 225.648 MHz
- Signal information The data rate at which the signal is being transmitted.
- Rechargeable battery status information Charge 100% indicates a full charge
- 1. Repeatedly press and release the **Menu** button to cycle through the different information options.

## Dynamic range control (DRC)

In DAB mode

The dynamic range for each radio programme is set by the broadcaster for each radio station and may be different for the types of programme broadcast, such as pop or classical music or a chat show. The dynamic range control signal is transmitted in parallel with the audio signal for each programme and with your radio you can use this control signal to expand or compress the dynamic range (the difference between the loudest and quietest sounds) of the reproduced audio signal. Changing the dynamic range can affect the 'loudness' and/or 'quality of sound' of the programme that you hear so that it will be more suited to your listening conditions and your own personal listening requirements. e.g. in a noisy environment, where quiet sounds might be swamped, setting the compression to maximum will 'boost' the quiet sounds, whilst keeping the loudest sounds at their original level.

There are 3 levels of compression:

• **DRC Off**: no compression. This is the default setting.

DRC Low: medium compression.

DRC High: maximum compression.

Using your Handheld DAB Radio



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Let's get started

- 1. Press and hold the Menu button to enter the menu options.
- 2. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight 'DRC' and press and release the Select button. The current DRC setting will have a '②' to the right of the display.
- 3. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to move through the 3 compression level options available and press and release the Select button. Your DRC selection (Off, Low or High) will now be displayed on the right hand side of the display, opposite DRC in the Menu list. Press and release the Menu button to return to the station display.

#### **FM Radio mode**

If you are not already in FM mode, briefly press and release the **Mode** button to go to FM mode (check the display). If you were listening to an FM station when you switched the Radio off then this station will be automatically selected when you switch the Radio back on


## Telescopic aerial

Please make sure that the aerial is fully extended before you attempt to tune to an FM station. This will ensure that the maximum signal strength is available when the radio begins to scan. Extending the aerial also ensures the best possible sound quality.

## Tuning to an FM station

Press and hold the  $\blacktriangleright$  button to scan up the frequency band. Press and hold the  $\blacktriangleleft$  button to scan down the frequency band. Press and release the  $\blacktriangleleft$  and  $\blacktriangleright$  buttons to fine tune each frequency in 0.05MHz steps.

Note: If reception is still poor adjust the position of the aerial or try moving the radio to another location

## Changing the Scan setting

#### In FM mode:

- 1. Press and hold the Menu button to enter the menu options.
- 2. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight 'Scan Setting'. Press and release the Select button. The current Scan Setting will have a '②' to the right of the display.

There are two different options to choose from:

· Strong Stations Only

The scan will only stop when a strong signal strength is received which should also result in a better audio quality. It is possible that the station you are scanning for may be missed using this option.

All Stations

The scan will stop for every station it receives, even if the signal strength is poor.

3. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to choose from the two options available and press and release the Select button. Your Scan Setting selection will now be displayed on the right hand side of the display, opposite Scan Setting in the Menu list. Press and release the Menu button to return to the station display.

#### **Audio mode**

The radio will automatically switch between Stereo and Mono, depending on the quality of the signal being received but you can override this function and manually switch between 'Stereo' and 'Mono'.

Note: You may wish to select 'Stereo' if you are listening to your radio using headphones.

- 1. Press and hold the **Menu** button to enter the menu options.

- 3. There are now two different options of 'Forced Mono' and 'Stereo Allowed' and the current setting will have a  $\bigcirc$  to the right of the display.
- 4. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to choose from the two options available. Press and release the Select button. Your Audio Setting selection will now be displayed on the right hand side of the display, opposite Audio Setting in the Menu list.
- 5. Press and release the **Menu** button to return to the station display.

## Storing an FM station preset

Your radio can store up to 20 FM stations in its preset memories for instant access to your favourite stations

Note: When you store FM radio station presets, these do not overwrite your DAB station presets.

- 1. Tune your radio to the station that you wish to preset (see tuning to an FM station on page 22).
- 2. Press and hold the Preset button. 'Save to Preset' and a list of numbered preset locations is displayed (1-20).
- 3. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight the Preset location that you would like to store the radio station to (1-20).
- 4. Press and release the **Select** button, the display will confirm '**Preset X saved**', where 'X' is the number of the preset (1-20).

Note: If there is already an existing FM station stored under a preset, it will be overwritten when you store the new station.

## Tune to an FM preset station

In FM mode

1. Press and release the Preset button. 'Preset Recall' and a list of numbered preset locations is displayed. The name or frequency of any stored stations is also displayed or '(Empty)' if no previous station has been stored.

2. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight the Preset location and station that you would like to listen to (1-20). Press and release the **Select** button. The radio will tune to that station and begin to play.

Note: If no FM station has been stored under the preset button, 'Preset Empty' will be displayed and the radio will revert to the previously selected radio station.

## FM display information

When listening to an FM station you can change the information that will appear on the display.

Radiotext (RT)

This is scrolling text information supplied by the broadcaster. Information could be the name of an artist or music title, DJ's name, contact details for the radio station etc.

Program Type (PTY)

Such as 'Rock', 'Pop', Talk' or 'News'

• Station name or frequency

Such as BBC R4 or 93.30MHz

Audio mode

Stereo or Mono

· Time and date

Supplied by the broadcaster.

· Rechargeable battery status information

E.g. Battery 93%

1. Repeatedly press and release the **Menu** button to cycle through the different information options.

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Let's get started

#### Time and date

The first time you listen to DAB radio, the time and date of your product will be synchronised automatically to that broadcast by the DAB service in 24 hour mode; which is in line with daylight saving, so there is no need to set the time and date manually.

If you do wish to set the time and date manually, turn on the radio and follow the steps below

- 1. Press and hold the Menu button to enter the Menu options.
- 2. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight System Settings. Press and release the **Select** button.
- 3. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight 'Time/Date'. Press and release the Select button. 'Set Time/Date' is displayed. Press the Select button again.
- **4.** 'Set Time/Date' is displayed and the day will flash. Use the ◀ or ▶ buttons together with the Select button to display and select the correct day, month and year.
- 5. The hour will now flash. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to display the correct hour and press and release the **Select** button
- The minutes will now flash. Use the 

  or 

  button to display the correct minutes.

  Press and release the Select button.

When you confirm the correct time. 'Time Saved' is displayed and the display returns to 'Set Time/Date'

You can now use the ◀ and ▶ buttons together with the **Select** button to scroll, change and confirm the other settings in the list:

Set 12/24 hour clock display. Set Date Format, DD-MM-YYYY or MM-DD-YYYY and to Auto Update the time from the DAB signal, FM signal, DAB or FM signal or No Update.

## Setting the alarm

Note: Check that the radio has the correct time and date before you set an alarm.


With your radio switched on (not in Standby mode):

1. Press and hold the **Menu** button to enter the menu options.

- 2. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight 'System Settings'. Press and release the Select button.
- 3. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight 'Alarm' and press and release the Select button. 'Alarm 1' and 'Alarm 2' are displayed. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight the alarm that you'd like to set.
- 4. Press and release the **Select** button to display the Alarm information and options available
- 5. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to scroll to each Alarm option in the list. Press the Select button. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to change each setting and press the Select button to confirm.

Note: Remember to set the alarm radio volume to one that will wake you. The alarm volume will increase progressively until it reaches the alarm volume you have set.

- 6. Check that you have selected to turn the Alarm 'On' before you exit the Alarm menu.
- 7. When an alarm has been set, an alarm clock symbol will appear at the bottom of the display, when the radio is on. In Standby mode, the time you have set for each alarm (Alarm 1 and/or Alarm 2) will also be displayed.

## Stop the Alarm

When the alarm sounds, press and release any button (except Select) to stop the Alarm. 'Alarm off' is displayed. Alternatively, you can press and release the **Select** button (see Snooze function below).

Note: The alarm symbol will remain in the display and the alarm will sound again at the same time the next day, unless it was set for 'Once' only.

#### Snooze

When the alarm sounds you can press and release the **Select** button to snooze for 10 minutes. A snooze time countdown will be displayed until the alarm sounds again.

#### Turn off the Alarm

1. Follow the steps for setting an Alarm but Select to turn Alarm 1 or 2 off in Step 4 above.

## Sleep timer

You can set your radio to turn off automatically using the sleep timer. You can choose from Sleep off, 10, 15, 20, 30, 45, 60, 75 and 90 minutes.

In DAB or FM mode:

- 1. Press and hold the Menu button to enter the menu options.
- 2. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight 'System Settings'. Press and release the Select button.
- 3. 'Sleep' is highlighted. Press and release the Select button.
- **4.** Use the **◄** or **▶** button to move through the available options. Stop when the sleep time you would like is displayed and press and release the **Select** button.
- 5. The sleep time minutes that you have selected will be displayed in the bottom of the display e.g. 45, and will countdown until the radio switches off.

Note: To cancel the sleep time, follow the steps to set the sleep time but stop when 'Sleep off' is displayed and press and release the Select button.

## Display backlight

You can adjust the display backlight timeout as well as the brightness for the 'On' or 'Dim' level.

Backlight options available are: Permanently On, 10, 20, 30, 45, 60, 90, 120, and 180 seconds

Brightness options available are: High, Medium and Low.

Note: A 'O' will be displayed to the right of the current setting.

#### In DAB or FM mode

- 1. Press and hold the **Menu** button to enter the menu options.
- Use the 

  or 

  button to highlight 'System Settings'. Press and release the Select button.
- 3. Use the 

  or 

  button to highlight Backlight. Press and release the Select button.
- 4. 'Timeout' is highlighted. You can now use the ◀ or ▶ button, together with the Select button to scroll, select, change and confirm the Backlight options available.
- 5. Press and release the **Menu** button to return to the station display.

## Display language

You can change the display language of your radio, there are 4 options available; English, Deutsch, Français, Italiano.

#### In DAB or FM mode:

- 1. Press and hold the **Menu** button to enter the menu options
- Use the 

  or 

  button to highlight 'System Settings'. Press and release the Select button
- 3. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight 'Language'. Press and release the Select button.
- 4. Use the 

  or 

  button to highlight the language you would like. Press and release the Select button. Your language setting selection will now be displayed on the right hand side of the display, opposite Language in the Menu list.
- 5. Press and release the Menu button to return to the station display.

#### Software version

You can check the software version of your radio.

#### In DAB or FM mode:

- 1. Press and hold the **Menu** button to enter the menu options
- Use the 

  or 

  button to highlight 'System Settings'. Press and release the Select button.



4. Press and release the Menu button to return to the station display.

#### **Factory reset**

You can reset your radio and restore all of the original factory settings.

Note: The product must be connected to the USB charging cable to enable a Factory Reset. If you reset your radio all of your stored station presets will be deleted.

In DAB or FM mode:

- 1. Press and hold the Menu button to enter the menu options
- 2. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight 'System Settings'. Press and release the Select button.
- 3. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight 'Factory Reset'. Press and release the Select button
- 4. 'All settings will be restored to factory defaults! Are you sure? 

  to list a displayed. Use the 

  or 

  button to highlight 'Yes'. Press and release the Select button.
- 5. If your radio is not connected to the USB charging cable 'Please connect to power supply' is displayed. If the radio is already connected to the USB charging cable, 'Restarting...' is displayed, followed by 'Welcome to Digital Radio'.

















## **Troubleshooting**

If you are experiencing problems with your radio, there are some quick and easy checks that you can do, which may help to solve the problem.

#### No sound / power:

Adjust the volume using  $\odot$  and  $\odot$  buttons on the top of your radio.

You may have headphones connected. Either use the headphones to listen to your radio or unplug the headphones.

The rechargeable battery may be exhausted, please recharge the battery, see page 8.

#### Radio reception is poor:

Fully extend the aerial to get the best reception and sound quality.

Retune for radio stations, see pages 18 and 22.

Try moving your radio to another location to see if reception improves.

Check that you do not have other electrical equipment too close to your Radio, causing interference



#### The function buttons do not respond:

The rechargeable battery may be exhausted, please recharge the battery, see page 8.

Try a reset to factory defaults. See page 30.
