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# Safety information

# **Important** - Please read these instructions fully before installing or operating

### Power source

The TV should be operated only from a  $100-240V \sim 50/60$ Hz outlet.

AC voltage: Rated voltage marked with this symbol is AC voltage.

 Warning: Do not leave your TV in standby or operating mode when you leave your house.

# Positioning the TV

This product is intended for indoor use only. For ventilation, please leave a clear space of at least 10cm all around the TV.(Fig 1)



- Do not block the ventilation openings.
- **Do not** place the TV on sloping or unstable surfaces, the TV may tip over.
- To prevent damage to the TV, do not place any objects on top of the TV.
- Only use the TV in moderate climates.

# Power cord and plug

- The power cord plug should be easily accessible. In case of storms and lightning, when going on holiday, or when the TV is not used for a long period of time disconnect the power cord from the mains power socket.
- **Do not** place the TV, furniture, etc. on the power cord or pinch the cord.
- Handle the power cord by the plug, do not unplug the TV by pulling the power cord.

- Never touch the power cord/plug with wet hands as this could cause a short circuit or electric shock.
- Never make a knot in the power cord or tie it with other cords.
- Power cords should be placed in such a way that they are not likely to be stepped on or driven over.
- A damaged power cord/plug can cause fire or give you an electric shock. When damaged it must be replaced, this should only be done by qualified personnel.

### Moisture and water

- **Do not** use this TV in a humid or damp place (avoid bathrooms, the sink in the kitchen, and near the washing machine).
- **Do not** expose this TV to rain or water, as this may be dangerous.
- Do not place objects filled with liquids, such as flower vases, on top of the TV. Avoid from dripping or splashing.
- If any solid object or liquid falls into the cabinet, unplug the TV and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.

### Ventilation

- The slots and openings on the TV set are intended for ventilation and to ensure reliable operation.
- To prevent overheating, these openings must not be blocked or covered in anyway.

### Heat sources and flames

- **Do not** expose the TV to direct sunlight or other heat sources.
- The TV should not be placed near to open flames and sources of intense heat such as an electric heater.
- Ensure that no open flame sources, such as lighted candles, are placed on top of the TV.



 Warning: To prevent the spread of fire, keep candles or other open flames away from this product at all times.

### Headphone volume

Excessive sound pressure from earphones and headphones can cause hearing loss, please take care.

### Wall mounting (optional)

- To prevent injury, this TV must be securely attached to the wall in accordance with the installation instructions (if the option is available).
- Do not install the TV on a ceiling or on an inclined wall.

### **LCD Screen**

- The LCD screen is a very high technology product with about a million thin film transistors, giving you fine picture details. Occasionally, a few non-active pixels may appear on the screen as a fixed blue, green or red point. Please note that this does not affect the performance of your product.
- Take care not to scratch the screen with fingernails or other hard objects.

### Cleaning

- Before cleaning, unplug the TV from the wall socket.
- **Do not** use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Only use a soft, dry cloth.

### **Batteries**

**Warning:** Incorrect installation of batteries may cause battery leakage and corrosion, resulting in damage to the remote control.

**Do not** mix old and new batteries, or batteries of different types.

**Do not** dispose of batteries with normal household waste, take to a local recycling centre.

The batteries shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.



Children may not recognize dangers. The swallowing of batteries can be fatal. Keep batteries always out of reach of small children. If a battery is swallowed, seek immediate medical attention.

### Replacement parts

### Installing / Removing the Base Stand


### **Base Stand Assembly Instruction**

- 1. Lay the TV flat on a table with the LED screen face down. To prevent the TV from being scratched, put a piece of soft cloth on the table on which the screen will be set.
- 2. Place the base in position as shown. Insert and tighten 4 screws (provided) into pedestal holes as shown.



### **Wall Mounting Installation Guidelines**

- 1. Lay the TV flat on a table with the LED screen face down. To prevent the TV from being scratched, put a piece of soft cloth on the table on which the screen will be set.
- 2. Remove the 4 screws.
- 3. Remove the stand.



4. Use the 4 screws (6\*8mm,not included) to fix the TV onto a wall mounting bracket (not included) via the four VESA standard holes on the back of the television.


### **INSTALLATION NOTES**

This TV can be connected to an AC 100-240 Volts, 50/60 Hz power supply. Never connect straight to a DC power supply.

Locate the TV in a room where light does not strike the screen directly. Total darkness or a reflection on the screen can cause eyestrain. Soft and indirect lighting is recommended for comfortable viewing.

Allow enough space between the TV and the wall to permit ventilation.


Avoid excessively warm locations to prevent possible damage to the cabinet or premature component failure.



200 x 200mm VESA mount





### **Aerial connection**

Connect a coaxial cable (not provided) to the ANT/ CABLE IN jack on the back of your TV and to the antenna or cable TV wall jack.




Connect the incoming cable from the cable wall jack to the cable-in jack on the cable or satellite box. Connect a coaxial cable (not provided) to the ANT/CABLE IN jack on the underside of your TV and to the coaxial out jack. on the cable or satellite box.



### **Power connection**

Connect the power cord plug to the mains power socket.

**Please note:** After unpacking, allow the TV to reach ambient room temperature before connecting the TV to the mains power socket.




### Remote control - Inserting batteries

Remove the battery cover on the back of the remote control, gently push down and pull backwards at the same time as shown .

Insert two AAA/R3 or equivalent type batteries. Ensure the batteries are inserted the correct way and replace the battery cover.

**Note:** When the remote control is not going to be used for long periods of time, the batteries should be removed. Otherwise the remote control may be damaged, caused by battery leakage and corrosion.



# Switching the TV On and Off

### Switching the TV On

With power cord plug connected to the mains power socket and TV in 'Standby' mode.

To switch the TV on from standby mode, either:

- a: The Remote control; Press the "O" button.
- b: The TV; Press the "O" button on the bottom of the TV.

### Switching the TV Off

Either press the "0" button on the remote control or press the "0" button on the bottom of the TV, the TV will then switch to standby mode.

### Operation using remote control

The remote control is designed to control all the TV functions.

### **Volume Setting**

Press **VOL+** button to increase the volume. Press **VOL-** button to decrease the volume. A volume level scale (slider) will be displayed on the screen.

### Programme Selection (Previous or Next Programme)

Press **CH-** button to select the previous programme. Press **CH+** button to select the next programme.

### **Programme Selection (Direct Access)**

Press number buttons on the remote control to select programmes between 0 and 9. The TV will switch to the selected programme.



### **Initial setup**

- **1.** Connect one end of the RF coaxial cable to the aerial socket on the wall and the other end of the cable to the RF (75 $\Omega$ ) socket at the bottom of your TV.
- **2.** Connect the mains cable to the mains socket after you have completed all the connections.
- **3.** With power cord plug connected to the mains power socket and TV in '**Standby**' mode. At this stage, the TV switches to standby mode. The red LED indicator will illuminate on the bottom panel of the TV.
- **4.** In standby mode, press the "O" button on the bottom of the TV or the "O" button on the remote control to turn the TV on. The red LED indicator will turn blue.
- **5.** The first time you turn the TV on, please ensure the TV is connected to the aerial, then press the **OK** buttons for the next setup.



6. Select your language.




7. Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to select your country.

- 8. Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to select the environment.
- Home Mode: Viewing at home.
- Store Mode: For store demo, the brightness is higher than home mode but consumes more power.



9. Press the ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ buttons to select the default source.





# Bringing it all together

### Left bottom connections explained

### 1. LAN

To use the wired network connection, connect an RJ-45 Ethernet cable (not included) from the jack on the back of your TV to your network router. When connected to the network, it has only two functions:

- Update network time.
- OTA (Over-the-Ari Technology) will use it to update software.

### 2. SCART socket

Inputs or outputs for external devices. Connect the SCART cable between the SCART socket on the TV and the SCART socket on the external device (decoder, VCR or DVD player).

**Note:** If an external device is connected via the SCART socket, the TV will automatically switch to SCART mode.

### 3. COAXIAL

Connect to the digital audio input socket on a digital / standard 5.1 audio system.

### 4. RF Input (ANT.)


Connects to aerial (antenna) or cable TV. If you use a decoder or a media recorder, you should connect the aerial cable through the device to the TV with an appropriate aerial cable.

### 5. HDMI Input

Connects a device that has an HDMI socket. The TV can display High Definition pictures from devices such as a High Definition Satellite Receiver or DVD Player. These devices must be connected via the HDMI sockets or Component Socket. No sound connection is needed for an HDMI to HDMI connection.

### Note: For HDMI 2 only

In addition to normal HDMI and HDMI-DVI functionality, it outputs TV audio to an HDMI-ARC compliant device, such as a soundbar / home theatre system.

### Left side connections explained

### 6. USB Input

To connect devices to the TV, providing fast data exchange. USB will have function in USB/DTV mode.

### 7. MINI AV/YPbPr-R/L

Connect to the composite VIDEO and AUDIO (R/L) output sockets on external video devices.

### 8. MINI YPbPr

YPbPr Input socket is just suitable for YPbPr Mini Cable. Connect to a DVD player, Digital Set-Top-Box, or other AV devices with component (YPbPr) video output sockets.


Note: Pls. use "MINI AV/YPbPr-R/L" socket, when you want to connect to YPbPr audio.

### 9. CI Slot

Used to insert a CI card. A CI card allows you to view all the channels that you subscribe to. For more information, see "Common Interface" section.

### 10. Headphone jack

To connect an external headphone to the TV. Connect to the HEADPHONE jack to listen to the TV from headphones. **Note:** Headphone volume can be changed using "VOL+" or "VOL-" buttons.



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# Bringing it all together

### **HDMI Connections**

HDMI lets you enjoy high definition digital images and high quality sound by connecting the TV to external devices such as DVD players, set top boxes or gaming equipment.


Power off both the TV and the device before making any connections.

For more information, refer to your device's own instruction book.

When connecting, switch "INPUT" to "HDMI 1/ HDMI 2/

HDMI 3" .See, "Selection Source" section.

Note: HDMI cable is not supplied.




### **SCART Connections**

Most devices support SCART connection. You can connect a DVD recorder, VCR or decoder to the TV using the SCART socket.

Power off both the TV and the device before making any connections

For more information, refer to your device's own instruction book.

Note: The Scart cable is not supplied.

# How to navigate menus - Selecting source

- **1.** Press the INPUT button on the remote control to display the Input source list.
- 2. Press the ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ buttons to select the input source that you want: Digital / Analogue / SCART / YPbPr / HDMI 1 / HDMI 2 / HDMI3 / AV.
- 3. Press OK button to confirm your selection.



# Electronic programme guide (EPG) (DTV mode)

This system has an Electronic Programme Guide (EPG) to help you navigate through all the possible viewing options.

The EPG supplies information such as programme listings, start and end times for all available services. In addition, detailed information about the programme is often available in the EPG (the availability and amount of programme information will vary, depending on the particular broadcaster).

This function can be used only when the EPG information is broadcast by broadcasting companies.

The EPG displays the programme details for the next 7 days

1. Press the EPG button to switch on EPG.



**2.** Press **EPG** button or **EXIT** button again to switch off EPG and return to normal TV viewing.

### Info bar commands:

**RED** (Remind)

Press the **RED** button while on the selected programme, the Remind setting menu will be displayed. You can view and set the reminder time and frequency.

### **GREEN** (PVR)

Press the **GREEN** button while on the selected programme, the Record setting menu will be displayed. You can view and set the recording time and frequency.

### YELLOW (Prev. Day)

Press the **YELLOW** button to view the schedule of the previous day.

### **BLUE** (Next Day)

Press the **BLUE** button to view the schedule of the next day.

### REC

Timer Programming.

**Note:** A USB storage device must be connected to one of the USB inputs to use the PVR or REC functions.

### OK

Press to display detailed information of the selected programme (if available).

# Simple everyday use

### Teletext (ATV mode)

Teletext is a free service broadcast by some TV stations which gives up-to-the-minute information on news, weather, television programmes, share prices and many other topics. Using the Teletext control buttons you can view pages of information that are listed in the teletext INDEX.

### To Turn on Teletext Function



Make sure the TV channel you are watching transmits teletext.

"No Teletext" sign will show on the screen if teletext is not available

In ATV mode, press the **TEXT** button to enter Teletext mode. Press the **INDEX** button to display the **INDEX** page.

Press the **TEXT** button once to exit and the TV will return to the channel you were watching.

### To select a page of text

Find the number of the page in the **INDEX** and enter it using the **0-9** buttons. The number of the page will appear on the top left corner of the screen.

The page counter will search for your page. When it finds it, the page will be displayed. To move to the next page of text, press the ▲ button.

To move to the previous page, press the ▼ button. To return to the **INDEX** page, enter the "100" by using the 0-9 buttons or press the **INDEX** button.

### Mix

To view a page of text while watching a TV programme, press the **TEXT** button twice.

The text will be superimposed over the TV programme. Double height text If you have difficulty reading the text on the TV you can double the height of the text.

Press the **SIZE** button. The top half of the page will be displayed in double height text.

Press the **SIZE** button again. The bottom half of the page will be displayed in double height text.

Press the SIZE button again to return to the full page.

### Page HOLD

If the page of text you have selected contains subpages, these subpages will automatically be displayed in order with a delay to allow you to have enough time to read the page.

To stop the movie to the next sub page, press the **HOLD** button.

To continue moving through the sub pages, press the **HOLD** button again.

**Alternative:** Press the **SUBPAGE** button, and then use the **0-9** buttons to enter a 4-digit page number.

### To Reveal Information

Press the **REVEAL** button to reveal concealed information (quiz answers etc.).

Press the **REVEAL** button again to conceal the information again.

#### **Fasttext**

At the bottom of the teletext screen is a row of subject headings in red, green, yellow and blue.

The remote control has a row of colour buttons corresponding to the row of coloured subjects on the screen.

Pressing one of the colour buttons will take you directly to the page corresponding to the subject heading.

# Simple everyday use

### Digital Teletext (DTV mode)

Digital teletext can access special digital teletext services and specific services which broadcast digital teletext. You will need to turn off Subtitle Function before using teletext

**1.** In DTV mode, press the **TEXT** button to display the teletext page.



- 2. Press the 0-9 buttons to select a page number.
- 3. Follow the instructions on digital teletext and move onto the next step by pressing OK, ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶, RED, GREEN, YELLOW, BLUE or 0-9 buttons etc.
- **4.** To change digital teletext service, select a different service by pressing the **0-9** buttons or the ▲ ▼ buttons.
- 5. Press the **TEXT** button to exit

# Recording DTV Programme onto a USB Storage Device

Use this function to record the DTV programme you are watching on the main screen and save it for future viewing. The recording from timer programme or direct recording may have a little bit of delay when it starts to record the broadcast programme.

Please make sure the USB device is inserted. If not, a warning message will pop up.

**1.** Press the • **REC** button to record the programme that you are currently watching.



To display the recording information, press the ● REC button.



2. Press the Stop button to stop recording.



- If a hard disk is used, make sure its mains adapter is connected to the mains supply.
- If a USB hub is used, make sure its mains adapter is connected to the mains supply as the total current consumption may exceed 500mA.
- The maximum supported storage space of the hard disk is 1 TB.
- The file system only supports FAT32 format.
- If you want to store the video streaming of a DTV programme, the transfer rate of the USB storage device must not be less than 5MB/s, otherwise the picture and sound of the programme will be affected and a warning statement will be shown on the screen. If this happens, please upgrade your USB storage device.
- The TV screen will be blank temporarily as it will take time to start up and stabilise the connected hard disk. This is normal and the starting time may vary depending on the brand and the memory size of the connected hard disk.
- Disconnect the USB storage device if it is not in use.

# Simple everyday use

### **Timer Programming**

This function is used for scheduled recording. The recording from timer programme or direct recording may have a little bit of delay when it starts to record the broadcast programme.

Please make sure the USB device is inserted. If not, a warning message will pop up.

**1.** Press the **EPG** button on the remote control. The **EPG** menu will appear.



2. Press the • (REC) button on the remote control while on the selected programme, the PVR menu will be displayed. Press the ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ buttons to select the settings in the Record menu for the Repeat, Record time.



### Repeat

Press the ◀► buttons to select the Repeat (Once / Every day / Weekly).

### Record time

Press the ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ buttons to adjust the start time and the end time

- **3.** After finishing all the recorder adjustments, press the Save button to confirm your settings.
- **4.** The Record Setting List will then be displayed with your preset reminders shown.

5. Press the EXIT button to exit EPG.



- When the preset time is reached, the TV will start recording automatically.
- If a programme recording starts when the TV is in standby mode, the LED indicator will alternatively flash red and blue.

Simple everyday use

### **Play Recorded Programme**

You can play a recorded programme from the recorded programme list or from a USB Storage Device.

1. Press the INPUT button on the remote control then press the ◀ ▶ ▲ ▼ buttons to select the Media mode and then press the OK button to select your storage device and then press the OK button.



2. Press the ◀ ▶ ▲ ▼ buttons to select Movies and then press the OK button.



**3.** Press the ◀▶▲▼ buttons to select your recorded programme and then press the **OK** button to view.



**4.** Press the **OK** button or the **INFO** button to display the function bar. Press the **◆** buttons and then press the **OK** button to select the function: Previous / FB / Pause(Play) / FF / Next / Repeat / Playlist / Info / Zoom.



**5.** Press the **EXIT** button to return to the previous menu.

# Quick Settings management (ATV / DTV Mode)

- **1**. Press the **MENU** button to display the main menu. Press the **OK** buttons to select Quick Settings in the main menu, it will highlight the first option.
- 2. Press the ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ buttons to change the following settings.



### Audio Language (DVT mode)

Press the  $\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$  buttons to select your desired Audio language.Press the  $\blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleright$  buttons to select L/R.

### Audio Language (AVT mode)

Language selection for dual language broadcast. If a programme can be received in two languages (dual language), you can swith to DUAL I, DUAL II or Mono by pressing the **AUDIO** button repeatedly.


When a programme is selected, press the **AUDIO** button to select Stereo, Dual I, Dual II and Mono.

### Subtitle Language

Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to select your desired subtitle language.

### **Record List**

Select Record List to check the information of the connected USB storage device for PVR.





# Simple everyday use

### **Event List**

Select Event list to view the scheduled recordings list.


3. Press the EXIT button to exit the menu.

# Picture management (ATV / DTV Mode)

- 1. Press the **MENU** button to display the main menu. Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to select Picture in the main menu, then press the **OK** button, it will highlight the first option.
- 2. Press the ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ buttons to change the following settings.

#### TIPS:

- You can change the value of brightness, contrast, colour, tint, sharpness and backlight when the picture is in Personal mode.
- You can press **P.MODE** button on the remote control to change the Picture Mode directly.



### **Picture Mode**

Allows the selection of a picture-enhancement technical from among the following options: Standard / Personal / Dynamic / Movie / Economy .

### **Brightness**

This item can adjust the brightness output of the entire picture; it will affect the dark region of the picture.

### Contrast

This item can adjust the highlight intensity of the picture, but the shadow of the picture is invariable.

### Colour

This item can adjust the saturation of the colour based on your own preference.

### **Tint**

This item may use in compensating colour changed with the transmission in the NTSC mode. N.B. Not available for PAL transmission.

### Sharpness

This item can adjust the peaking in the detail of the picture.

### Backlight

This item can adjust the backlight of the colour based on your own preference.

### **Aspect Ratio**

Allows you to watch the screen in various picture formats: Auto / 16:9 / 4:3 / Zoom1 / Zoom2.

### **Advanced Settings**

- OverScan: The screen is fully displayed when OverScan off. Part of the screen will not show when OverScan on. Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to select On or Off.
- Colour Temperature: Reduces the colour temperature of the connected device (Standard / Cold / Warm).
- Dynamic Contrast: Adjusts the dynamic contrast (Off / Low / High).
- Noise Reduction: Reduces the noise level of the connected device (Off / Low / Medium / High).
- 3. Press the EXIT button to exit the menu.

# Sound management

- 1. Press the MENU button to display the main menu.

  Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to select Sound in the main menu, then press the OK button, it will highlight the first option.
- 2. Press the ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ buttons to change the following settings.

### TIPS:

• You can press the **S.MODE** button on the remote control to change the Sound Mode directly.



### Sound Mode

Allows the selection of an audio-enhancement technical from among the following options: Standard, Music, Sports, Movie and Personal.

### **DTS TruSurround**

This creates a surround sound effect to your TV when switched on is off. Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to select On or Off.

# Simple everyday use

### Speaker

- Audio Out : Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to select PCM, RAW or Off
- Digital Audio Delay: Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to set value of your preference.

### **AVC**

Automatic volume control. Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to select On or Off.

### **Advanced Settings**

- Balance: Adjusts the relative volume of the speakers in a multiple speaker system. Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to set value based on your own preference.
- Treble: Controls the relative intensity of higher-pitched sounds. Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to set value based on your own preference.
- Bass: Controls the relative intensity of lower-pitched sounds. Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to set value based on your own preference.

### Image persistence - ghosting
