

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Important - Please read these instructions fully before assembling or operating

Power source

- For household and indoor use only
- Keep the appliance and its cord out of reach of children less than 8 years.
- Do not allow children to use appliance without supervision.
- This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children unless they are aged from 8 years and above and supervised.
- Do not pull on the charge cable to disconnect from mains supply.
- Fully unwind the charge cable before plugging in and ensure the cable is positioned away from areas where it is likely to get damaged or cause a trip hazard.
- The output cord of this mains adaptor cannot be replaced. In the event of damage to the cable, jack plug or adaptor, the entire adaptor unit should be replaced.
- Connections must only be made via the mains adaptor supplied, never connect the appliance directly to the 240v mains supply.
- Never use the adaptor supplied with any other appliance.



Important - Please read these instructions fully before assembling or operating

- Remove mains adaptor from supply if appliance is unused for a long period of time, and during thunderstorms.
- Switch off and unplug when not in use and remove the battery before emptying, cleaning or servicing the appliance. Servicing of this appliance must only be carried out by a qualified electrician.
- When the battery is fully charged, disconnect the appliance from power socket. Do not use 'lockable' sockets or permanently wire the appliance to mains.

Ventilation, heat and moisture

- Keep the appliance, battery, charge cable and mains adaptor plug dry and away from areas where it is likely to get splashed.
 Avoid using in hot, humid environments.
- CAUTION: The extension tube, floor head and the vacuum cleaner contain electrical connections, do not immerse in water for cleaning or use it to suck up liquids.
- The mains adaptor will become warm in use; do not cover or place on or near surfaces that could be affected by heat such as table tops and carpets.

Warning!

- Entrapment hazard Do not place fingers or other objects near the rotating brush of the floor head or into the nozzles when the vacuum cleaner is in use. Always remove the floor head before carrying out cleaning and maintenance.
- Do not run the appliance off the edge carpets and rugs with fringes.



Important - Please read these instructions fully before assembling or operating

- Do not use the appliance to pick up burning or hot objects (e.g. coal, ash, cigarettes etc) of any kind.
- Do not cover the appliance or restrict air vents.
- Do not use the appliance to pick up sharp objects (e.g. pins, nails, tacks, staples etc) or string.

Battery safety

This vacuum cleaner has a rechargeable battery(Li-ion 28.8V 2000mAh).

- Never try to dismantle the vacuum cleaner.
- Do not short-circuit the supply terminals.
- Dispose of the vacuum cleaner responsibly at local authority household waste recycling facility.
- DO NOT dispose of the vacuum cleaner in a fire as the battery may explode or leak.
- 1. CAUTION-Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly fitted/replaced
- 2. Only use the battery supplied in this appliance
- 3. Be sure to insert battery correctly taking care to observe the correct polarity (+ and -)
- 4. Battery should be replaced by an adult
- 5. Remove battery from the product before long-term storage









Charging the Vacuum

This cleaner uses a rechargeable 28.8V Lithium battery suggest to charge fully before using for the first time. It takes 4-6 hours, and the vacuum can be used 10 mins with High Mode, 25 mins with Middle Mode,50 mins with low mode.

1. Place the body of the cleaner onto a flat surface either a table or fit into the wall bracket.



- 2. Insert the adaptor cord into the DC jack at the end of the cleaner handle and plug the adaptor into the mains supply socket (fig.1).
- 3. It defaults to the Middle mode when powered on with a full battery (Light 1, 2, and 3 are on simultaneously).

Press the "Speed control button" once for High Speed (Light 1 and 2 is on and Light 3 is blue), and press the "Speed control button" again for Low Speed (Light 1 and 2 is on and Light 3 is off); (Fig 2)

The light indicator show the status (Fig 2):

Charging: Light 1 flash, light 2 off

Half charged: Light 1 on, light 2 flash

Fully charged: light 1 & 2 on, then off in 10 mins


Low battery: light 1 flash, light 2 off

Notes

- Light indicator 1 (Fig 2) will flash when cleaner is running at low battery and needs to be recharged, If recharge not started, the vacuum will power off.
- Only charge or recharge the vacuum indoors.
- Don't use and store the batteries under 5°C or above 40°C.
- Batteries become hot after heavy use and will become difficult to charge. Allow to cool down and wait about an hour before recharges.


Wall mounting (Ref to the Wall mounting & fixings guide on page 18)

Safety

- Before drilling into wall surface, check for hidden cables or pipes.
- Wear safety goggles and dust mask when drilling.
- The use of a residual current device (RCD) is recommended when working with power tools.

Tools required

- Drill fitted with a 6mm masonry drill bit
- Screwdriver
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Spirit level
- 1. Choose a suitable location for the wall bracket away from areas where it will get wet or knocked and close to a socket. Check that the charge cable will reach the mains socket (180cm distance max) and that there is sufficient space above and below the bracket (approx. 120-125cm below) for the fully assembled vacuum cleaner be inserted. No part of the vacuum cleaner should touch the floor after fitted into the bracket (fig 6).

- 2. Place the bracket in the desired position and using a pencil, mark the position for the two screw holes. Using a ruler, draw a line joining the points marked for the two screws and using a spirit level, check that it is on the same level.
- 3. If fixing to a masonry wall, use a masonry drill bit, drill holes to a depth of 30mm and insert the wall plugs.
- 4. If fixing to ceramic tiles, use a tile and glass drill bit to drill through the tile and then drill holes to a depth of approximately 32 mm using a masonry drill bit. Insert the wall plugs beyond the depth of the tile.
- 5. Hold the bracket into position, align the fixing holes in the bracket with the wall plugs and insert the screws until the bracket is held firmly into position
- 6. Insert the assembled vacuum cleaner into the bracket (fig.7).

Notes:


- If fixing the bracket to timber, follow the directions above, but only drill a small pilot hole for each screw and do not use wall plugs. This fitting is not suitable for mounting onto doors.
- If fixing to hollow plasterboard walls, use a drill bit suitable for wood and use wall anchors suitable for cavity walls. For maximum strength locate into wall studs and cross braces if possible.

Assembly


- 1. Insert the extension tube onto the body of the vacuum as shown (fig. 8) and push to secure, a click will be heard.
- 2. Push the floor head onto the extension tube (fig. 8), a click will be heard. The crevice nozzle and combination nozzle can be fitted in place of the floor head.

3. Alternatively **DO NOT USE** the extension tube and fit the crevice nozzle or combination nozzle directly onto the body of the vacuum cleaner (fig. 9). The floor head can be fitted in a similar manner, but if using in this configuration ensure hands are kept away from the floor head during operation – due to a potential entrapment hazard.



- 4. Insert the battery pack and a click will be heard when correctly engaged.
- 5. To remove the all parts press the release button and accessories firmly pull apart.
- 6. To remove the battery, press the battery release button and firmly pull the battery from the body of the cleaner(Fig 10)




A Guide to

Wall Mounting & Fixings



IMPORTANT:

When drilling into walls always check that there are no hidden wires or pipes etc. Make sure that the screws and wall plugs being used are suitable for supporting your unit. Consult a qualified tradesperson if you are unsure.


HINTS:

- 1) General Rule Always use a larger screw and wall plug if you are not sure.
- 2) Ensure you use the recommended drill bit to match the wall plug and hole size.
- 3) Ensure you drill the hole horizontally, do not force the drill or enlarge the hole.
- 4) Take extra care when drilling high walls, ceilings and ceramic tiles. Ensure the plug is fitting below the ceramic tile to avoid splitting or cracking.
- 5) Ensure wall plugs are well fitted and are a tight fit in the drilled hole.

Types Of Walls


You can use one of the following types of wall plug if your walls are made of brick, breeze block, concrete, stone, wood or plaster board.

No.1 "Standard" Wall Plug **General Wall Materials**



These come in various sizes and are made from plastic or sometimes wood fiber.


No.2 "General Purpose" Wall Plug Aerated / Breeze Block



Generally aerated blocks should not be used to support heavy loads, use a specialist fitting in this case.


For light loads, a General Purpose Plug can be used.

No.3 "Shield Anchor" Wall Plug **Heavy Loads**




For use with heavier loads such as TV & HiFi Speakers and Satellite Dishes etc.

No.4 "Cavity Fixing" Wall Plug




For use with plaster board partitions or hollow wooden doors.

No.5 "Cavity Fixing - Heavy Duty" Wall Plug



For use when fitting or supporting heavy loads such as shelving, wall cabinets, coat racks.

No.6 "Hammer Fixing" Wall Plug



For use with walls stuck with plaster board. The hammer fixing allows it to be fixed to the wall rather than the plaster board. Always check the fixing is secure to the retaining wall.

Getting started

- 1. Fit the correct nozzle for the cleaning application, ensure that the battery has sufficient charge.
- 2. Click power ON/OFF button once to start, the Light 2 LED lights on the floor head (if fitted) will be illuminated and the vacuum cleaner will start with middle mode (light 1 and 2 is on and light 3 is white), press the "Speed Control Button" once for high speed (light 1 and 2 is on and light 3 is blue), press the "Speed Control Button" again for low speed (light 1 and 2 is on and light 3 is off).

- 3. Click the power button again to stop the vacuum cleaner after use.
- 4. Store the vacuum in the wall bracket when not in use.

Maintenance

Disconnect the charger from the vacuum cleaner before carrying out cleaning and maintenance.


To ensure your vacuum cleaner works at optimum efficiency, keep the ventilation holes and vacuum cleaner surface free from dirt.

Ensure that the dust container is emptied and the air filters are washed regularly.

- 1. Wipe the outside of the vacuum cleaner and accessories with a damp (not wet) cloth and then wipe dry. Do not use detergents, solvents or abrasives as these may scratch or damage the surface.
- 2. Never immerse the vacuum cleaner, battery or charger in water.
- 3. When not in use, store in a cool, dry place.

Emptying the dust container

- 1. When the dust container reaches the MAX line marked on the dust container (fig 11) or when the suction power is reduced, it is time to empty the dust container.
- 2. Press the lever at the front of the container to open the base (fig. 12) and empty the container. Gently tap the container against the side of the bin to remove any stubborn dust.








3. The inside of the dust container maybe wiped clean with a damp cloth. Dry with a soft dry cloth before closing the flap. A click will be heard when it is correctly engaged.


Cleaning the filters


- 1. The frequency that the filters should be cleaned will depend on appliance usage. For maximum efficiency, suggest shake off debris on pre-motor filter and exhaust filter when empty the bin container, rinse under water once a month.
- 2. Click the dust container release button, located on the front of the handle just above the dust container and pull dust container out(Fig 13)
- 3. Lift out the cyclone from dust container(Fig 14), lift out pre-motor filter and shake off dust fr equently .Every three months rinse filter and dry thoroughly(Fig 15), turn the filter assembly head clockwise to disassembly the cyclone filter(Fig 16), wash with running water, and make, sure it is dry before next use(Fig 17).

- 4. Tap the pre-motor filter against a dustbin to remove most of the dust and then 4wash the filter in cold running water until the water runs clear. Allow to air dry fully. Using a damp or wet filter will reduce the suction and damage the motor.
- 5. The pre-motor filter can also be washed under running water if needed.
- 6. When the pre-motor is completely dry, reverse the above steps and refit the filter into the dust container and close the flap. In each case turn in the direction of the locked padlock symbol(fig. 18).
- 7. To clean or replace the exhaust filter, turn the cover anticlockwise and lift off the cover(fig. 19), remove the filter(Fig.20), shake off debris, rinse under water once a month, allow to dry fully before refit.
- 8. Refit the exhaust filter and cover onto the cleaner.







Looking after your appliance

Cleaning the brush

- 1. The frequency that the brush should be cleaned will depend on appliance usage. Always stop the vacuum and clean the brush head if if the floor head brush stops rotating.
- 2. Remove the floor head from the cleaner (fig. 19).
- 3. Push the small lever at the side of the brush in the direction of the front of the floor head and lift off the retaining plate (fig. 20).
- 4. Lift out the roller brush (fig. 21) and remove any thread, fluff or other obstructions. The brush roller can also be washed under running water if needed. Allow to fully dry.

5. Refit the bush roller and secure into position by fitting the retaining plate.


