

- Dispose of all packaging carefully and responsibly.


Care and maintenance







Step 1

Insert dowels **A** into the indicated parts.





Step 2

Fixing runners.

Attach right runners P to the pre drilled holes on the right side panel 2 using screws 3.

Attach left runners **Q** to the pre drilled holes on the left side panel **3** using screws **B**.





Step 3


Fitting Metal dowels.

Screw metal dowels **[** into top panel **1**, large drawer fronts **6** and small drawer front **7**.



Note: Insert metal dowels as far as shown.

Do not over tighten.



Step 4

Fixing L shaped brackets.

Fix L shaped brackets L in the bottom frames 14 and 15 and top front frames 16 using screws B, as shown.

Attention: Leave 1mm gap from the edge of the bars as shown. L shaped brackets must be fixed to the unfinished side in frames 14 and 16.

Step 5

Assembling frames.

Fit bottom frames 14 and 15 and top front frames 16 into holes on right side panel 2, as shown. Then, fix frames in the right side panel through L shaped brackets using screws 3.


Finished sides to face outside and finished edges to face up.

Step 6

Fixing left side panel.

Place left side panel 3 properly ensuring dowels and front frames are all fitted into their holes at the same time.

Fix bottom frames 14 and 15 and top front frames 16 in the left side panel 3 through L shaped brackets L using screws 3, as shown.



Step 7

Fixing top panel.

With help, carefully stand the product upright.


With help, fit top panel 1 to the cabinet.


Insert 4 locking nuts **G** into side panels where shown.

Use a screwdriver to turn locking nuts **G** clockwise to lock.


Do not over tighten.

After screwing locking nuts, insert plastic caps **①**.









Step 8

Fixing back panels.


Important:
Cabinet MUST be 'square' when back panels are attached.

a: Attach top back panel

4 first using nails (H).

b: Position profile 17 onto back panel (just attach).

C: Carefully slot the second back panel 4 into the profile and fix it to the cabinet using nails 1.



Step 9

Attach plastic feet.

With help, carefully lay down the product.

Attach plastic feet **①** in the bottom edge of the right and left side panels using nails **①**.



Make sure nails are fully nailed.

After attach plastic feet, with help, carefully stand the product upright.

Step 10

Large drawer assembly.

a: Fix large drawer sides 10 and 11 to the large drawer back 8 using screws 3.

b: Slide drawer bottom **5** into slots on drawer sides.

C: With help, fit large drawer front **6** to the drawer sides.


Insert 2 locking nuts **G** into drawer sides where shown.


Use a screwdriver to turn locking nuts **G** clockwise to lock.

Do not over tighten.

After screwing locking nuts, insert plastic caps

Repeat step 10 for the other large drawer.





Step **11**

Small drawer assembly.

a: Fix small drawer sides 12 and 13 to the small drawer back 9 using screws **3**.

b: Slide drawer bottom **5** into slots on drawer sides.

C: With help, fit small drawer front **7** to the drawer sides.

Insert 2 locking nuts **G** into drawer sides where shown.

Use a screwdriver to turn locking nuts **G** clockwise to lock.

Do not over tighten.


After screwing locking nuts, insert plastic caps **1**.


Repeat step 11 for the other small drawer.

Step **12**

Attach plastic bracket.

Attach plastic bracket (s) in the bottom of the large and small drawers using screws (D).





Step 13


Fixing runners.


Attach right runners **P** and left runners **Q** in the bottom edge of the large and small drawers using screws **B**, as shown.

Make sure runners are correctly positioned according to the diagram prior to fixing.

Step **14**

Hook the wheels of the runner on the back of the drawers over the wheels of the runners on the left and right sides, then hold the drawers level and slide backwards into position.





Step **15**

Fixing to wall.

Furniture must be fixed to a wall. Fix wall strap • to top of furniture using washer • and screw •. With help, move furniture into position.

Note: Wall plugs not supplied. The correct type of fixing must be used for your wall, seek professional advice if in doubt. wall

A Guide to - Wall Mounting & Fixings

Important note:

If plastic wall plugs are supplied with your product:



- these are only suitable for use in masonry walls.

If you are in any doubt about the correct wall plugs for your wall, seek professional advice.

Failure of the product due to using incorrect fixings is the responsibility of the installer.



Important: When drilling into walls always check that there are no hidden wires or pipes etc.

Make sure that the screws and wall plugs being used are suitable for supporting your unit. Consult a qualifed tradesperson if you are unsure.


Hints:

- 1: General rule: Always use a larger screw and wall plug if you are not sure.
- **2:** Ensure you use the recommended drill bit to match the wall plug and hole size.
- **3:** Ensure you drill the hole horizontally, do not force the drill or enlarge the hole.
- **4:** Take extra care when drilling high walls, ceilings and ceramic tiles. Ensure wall plugs are inserted beyond the thickness of the ceramic tiles to avoid the tiles splitting or cracking.
- **5:** Ensure wall plugs are well fitted and are a tight fit in the drilled hole.

Types of walls


You can use one of the following types of wall plug if your walls are made of brick, breeze block, concrete, stone or wood.

No.1 "General Purpose" wall plug




Generally aerated blocks should not be used to support heavy loads, use a specialist fitting in this case. For light loads, general purpose wall plugs can be used.

No.2 "Plasterboard" wall plug




For use when attaching light loads on to plasterboard partitions.

No.3 "Cavity Fixing" wall plug




For use with plasterboard partitions or hollow wooden doors.

No.4 "Cavity Fixing-Heavy Duty" wall plug




For use when fitting or supporting heavy loads such as shelving, wall cabinets and coat racks.

No.5 "Hammer Fixing" wall plug



For use with walls stuck with plasterboard. The hammer fixing allows it to be fixed to the wall rather than the plasterboard. Always check the fixing is secure to the retaining wall.

No.6 "Shield Anchor" wall plug Heavy loads



For use with heavier loads such as TV & HiFi speakers and satelite dishes etc.



Safety: Always check the fitting and location to ensure your safety in and around the home.

Fitting: From time to time check the fitting to ensure the wall plugs or screws do not become loose.
