- This product should not be discarded with household waste. Take to your local authority waste disposal centre.


#### **Handy Hints**





## Ruler - Use this ruler to help correctly identify the screws





The screws length is measured from the head to the point (30mm screw shown).

Fitting dowels
Insert wooden
dowels into short
aprons 2 .

## Step 2


Attaching rails
Attach short rails 6
onto short aprons 2
with screws 3.

Fitting dowels
Insert wooden
dowels into long
aprons 4.

Attaching rails
Attach long rails 7
onto short aprons 4
with screws 3.

#### Step 6

Fitting bolts
Screw long bolts 
into legs 5 .

## Step 7

#### **Attaching legs**


a: Attach legs 5 onto short aprons 2 with semi-circle washers 6 & spring washers 7 & nut 9 with wrench 6 .

b: Cover holes with cap 😉 .

## Step 8

# Fitting dowels and cams

Screw long bolts into legs 5.
Insert wooden dowels into legs 5 and short aprons 2.



## Step 9

#### **Fixing fittings**

a: Fix connecting bolts (4).

Note:Insert bolt (4)

as far as shown.

Do not over tighten.

b: Insert long wooden dowels and locking cams into long aprons 4. Note: The slot position of locking cams shown.


## Fixing fittings

Insert wooden dowels and locking cams into connection bars 3. Note: The slot position of locking cams should be as shown.

## Step 11

## **Attaching panels**

Position connection bars 3 onto long aprons 4 as shown. Use screw driver to turn locking cams 5 clockwise to lock.



## Step 12

#### **Attaching panels**

Position connection bars 3 onto another long apron 4 as shown.
Use screw driver to turn locking cams 5


clockwise to lock.

## Step 13

## Attaching legs

a: Attach legs 5 onto long aprons 4 with semi-circle washers 6 & spring washers 6 & nut 6 with wrench 6 .

b: Cover holes with cap (c) .




## Step 14

#### **Attaching legs**

a: Attaching legs 5 onto another side of long aprons 4 with semi-circle washers 6 & spring washers 7 & nut 1 with wrench 6 .

b: Cover holes with cap 😉 .

c: Paste felt feet **()** on legs as shown.




## Step 15

#### **Fitting bolts**

Fix connecting bolts **(A)**.

Note:Insert bolt (2) as far as shown.

Do not over tighten.



## Step 16

#### **Attaching panels**


Two people are needed for this assembly.

Position top panel 1 onto table frame panels 2, 3, 4 and legs 5 as shown at same time.

Use screw driver to turn locking cams clockwise to lock.

Assembly is complete.

## **Care Instruction**

#### Care and Maintenance

- Use a soft, clean cloth that will not scratch the surface when dusting.
- Use of furniture polish is not necessary. Should you choose to use polish, test first in an inconspicuous area.
- Using solvents of any kind on your furniture may damage your furniture's finish.
- Never use water to clean your furniture as it may cause damage to the finish.
- Always use coasters under beverage glasses and flowerpots.
- Liquid spills should be removed immediately. Using a soft clean cloth, blot the spill gently. Avoid rubbing.
- Always use protective pads under hot dishes and plates. Heat can cause chemical changes that may create spotting within the furniture finish.
- Stains or marks from crayons or ink markers will be difficult to remove.
- In the event that your furniture is stained or otherwise damaged during use, we recommend that you call a professional to repair your furniture.

#### Further advice about wood furniture care

It is best to keep your furniture in a climate controlled environment. Extreme temperature and humidity changes can cause warping, shrinking and splitting of wood. Please keep furniture away from direct sunlight as this may damage the finish. Proper care and cleaning at home will extend the life of your purchase. Following these important and helpful tips will enhance your furniture as it ages.
