## Safety and use.....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

### • TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile when the vehicle is not parked.

When driving, do not use your phone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your phone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your phone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,
- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the dashboard is adequately shielded from mobile phone RF energy.

### • CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimise its performance.

Switch the phone off before boarding an aircraft.

Switch the phone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile telephones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the phone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, petrol station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere.

When the phone is switched on, it should be kept at least 15 cm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing aid or insulin pump, etc. In particular when using the phone, you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device, if any.

To avoid hearing impairment, pick up the call before holding your phone to your ear. Also move the handset away from your ear while using the "hands-free" mode because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

Do not let children use the phone and/or play with the telephone and accessories without supervision.

When replacing the cover please note that your phone may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Always handle your phone with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Do not allow your phone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (moisture, humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is -10°C to +55°C.

At over 55°C the legibility of the phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

Do not open, dismantle or attempt to repair your mobile phone yourself.

Do not drop, throw or bend your mobile phone.

Do not paint it.

During use, the actual SAR values for this device are usually well below the values stated above. Body-worn SAR testing has been carried out at a separation distance of 10 mm. 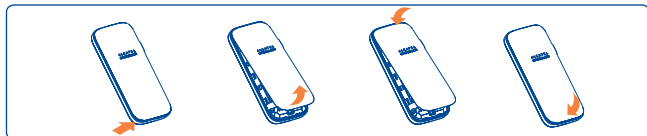

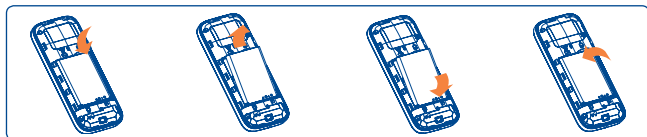

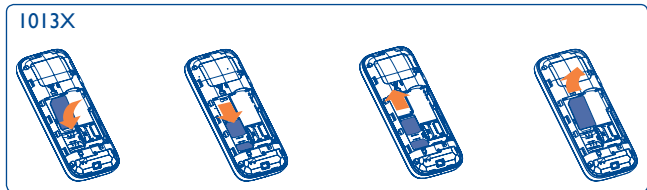
### Removing and installing the back cover

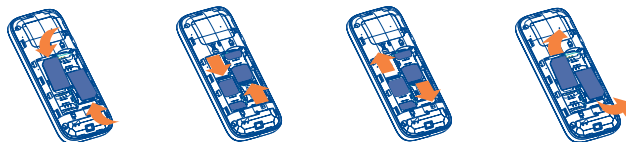


### Inserting and removing the SIM card <sup>(1)</sup>

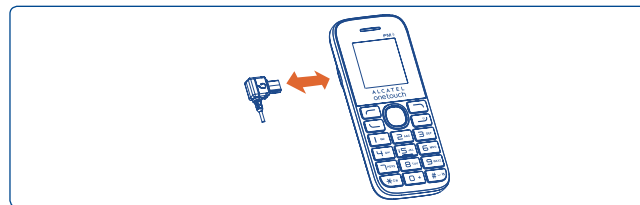


Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press it and slide it out.



Your phone only supports mini SIM card. Do not attempt to insert other SIM types like micro and nano cards, otherwise this can cause damage to your phone.


### Charging the battery



Connect battery charger to your phone and plug into the socket.

- Charging may take about 20 minutes to start if the battery is out of power.
- Be careful not to force the plug into the socket.
- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- The main socket must be close to the phone and easily accessible (avoid electric extension cables).




- You are advised to charge the battery to its maximum when using the phone for the first time (approximately 3 hours) (  ).
- To reduce power consumption and energy waste, when battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; reduce the backlight time, etc.




The charge is complete when the animation stops.

## 1.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the  key until the telephone powers on, type in your PIN code if necessary and then confirm. The main screen will be displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your telephone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

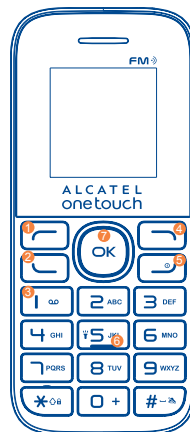
If cell broadcast messages are displayed, you can browse through them or press  to return to the main screen.

## 3 Calls.....

### 3.1 Making a call


Dial the desired number then press the  key to place the call. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the right softkey.

To hang up the call, press the  key.

#### Making an emergency call

If your phone is covered by the network, dial emergency number and press the  key to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.

### 3.2 Calling your voicemail <sup>(1)</sup>

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time. To access your voicemail, hold down the  key.



If the access number for your operator's voicemail service does not work, dial the number that you were given. To change this number, refer to "Voicemail" (see page 26).




To use your voicemail service from abroad, contact your network operator before leaving.

### 3.3 Receiving a call

When you receive an incoming call, press the  key to talk and then hang up using the  key.

If the  icon is displayed, the phone neither rings nor vibrates.



The caller's number is displayed if it is transmitted by the network (contact your network operator to check service availability).

#### Muting the ringtone

You may mute ringtone of current incoming call by pressing .

Answer the call by pressing the  key.

#### Rejecting a call

Press the  key once to reject the call.

### 3.4 During a call <sup>(1)</sup>

#### Available functions

During a call, you can access your directory, calendar, short messages, etc. without hanging up the phone.

# 4 Contacts .....

## 4.1 Consulting your contacts

You can search for a contact by inserting the initial of their name. Subsequent letters may be added to refine the search. You can also scroll up/down the contact list (A-Z) to find the contact you need.

### Viewing a contact

Select a name from your directory to read the contact information. Select "Options" to send messages, edit the contact, etc.

## 4.2 Adding a contact

You can add a new contact to phone or SIM card by selecting "Add contact".

Following fields are accessible when you create a new contact in the Contacts: Name, Number, etc.

You can move from one field to another by scrolling up and down.



If you use your phone abroad, store the numbers in your Contacts in international format "+" followed by the country code.

## 5 Messages.....

You can create, edit and receive SMS with this mobile phone.

### 5.1 Access

You may access this menu using the following options:

- Press  to enter the main menu screen, and then select .
- Access from  of navigation key.

### 5.2 Create message

From the main menu select "**Messages**" to create text. You can type a message and you can also modify a predefined message in **Templates**. While writing a message, select "**Options**" to access all of the messaging options. You can save your messages that you often send to **Drafts**. For dual SIM model, you can type a message and select to send it to a recipient in either the SIM1 or SIM2 directory <sup>(1)</sup>



An SMS message of more than a certain number of characters (the number of characters depends on your language) will be charged as several SMS. Specific letters (accent) will increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

## 5.3 Message folders

### 5.3.1 Inbox

**Channel settings** Subscribe/Add/Edit/Delete channels.

**Languages** Language selection.

**Read message** Read received messages

## 5.5 Voicemail

View or edit the number to access your voicemail and confirm by pressing "OK". Your telephone number is usually written on your SIM card.

## 5.6 Templates

A list of predefined messages is available. Select one, edit it if needed, and then send it.

## 5.7 Settings

**SIM** Comment settings of Validity period, delivery report On/Off, Reply path <sup>(1)</sup>.

**Memory status** Memory used on the phone.

**SMS counter** Numbers of Sent and Received SMS.

**Save sent message** Select of save sent messages or not.

**Pref. storage** Select default message storage, SIM or phone.


**Alphabet management** Enables the definition of SMS data coding for SMS sending.

## 6 Call log.....

### 6.1 Access

You can access the function using the following options:

- Select  from main menu.

## 7 FM Radio.....


Your phone is equipped with a radio <sup>(1)</sup> with RDS functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you tune to stations that offer Visual Radio service. # 9 Tools .....

## 9.1 Calculator

Access this feature by selecting **"Calculator"** from **"Tools"**.

Enter a number, select the type of calculation to be performed, and enter the second number, then press "=" to display the result.

Once an operation is complete, you can press  to clear numbers and carry out a new operation.

To return to the main screen, press .

## 9.2 Calendar

Once you enter this menu from **"Tools"**, there is a monthly-view calendar for your view.

### 9.4 Fake call

This program enables you to call yourself by simulating a caller number/ name, ringtone at a scheduled time. It helps you to politely escape from social situations at any time you wish. This call can be rejected by .

<b>Activate</b>	Activate a fake call by " <b>Fake call mode\Enable</b> ".
<b>Set caller name</b>	Predefine caller name of fake call.
<b>Set active time</b>	Predefine time for fake incoming call, the call will then be made at the predetermined time.
<b>Mode</b>	Select between <b>Ring</b> and <b>Silence</b> .
<b>Ringtone</b>	Predefine ringtone for fake call.

### 9.5 Call filter

To add numbers or contacts to **Blacklist/Whitelist**, press  to add from **Contacts**, **Call log**, **Messages**, you can also create directly by pressing .

<b>Blacklist</b>	Enable blacklist, all callers in the list will be automatically blocked.
<b>Whitelist</b>	Enable whitelist, only callers in the list can be connected.
<b>Settings</b>	You are allowed to select among <b>Enable Blacklist</b> , <b>Enable Whitelist</b> and <b>Disable Call filter</b> .

### 9.6 Torch

You can activate '**Torch**' to create light in darkness with these instructions:

In idle screen, press and hold  **S** **JKL** to activate the flashlight; press  or press and hold  **S** **JKL** to deactivate it.

## 10 Service .....

Contact your network operator to check service availability.

## 11 Alarm

Your mobile phone has a built-in alarm clock with a snooze feature. You can set up to five separate alarms and choose whether or not the alarm should repeat.


<b>Repeat</b>	You may select <b>Once</b> (default)/ <b>Everyday/Days (Mon-Fri)</b> or customize to your desire.
<b>Snooze</b>	The alarm will repeat at regular intervals.

<b>Ringtone volume</b>	Adjust the volume using the up/down key.

## 12.2 Silent

This profile will turn off all ringtones, including notification sounds.

## 12.3 Flight mode

Voice calls and messaging functions are barred. Can be used to increase standby duration.

# 13 Latin input mode.....

There are two text entry methods that can be used to write messages

- Normal
- Predictive with the eZi mode

### Normal

This mode allows you to type message by choosing a letter or a sequence of characters associated with a key.

### Predictive eZi mode

This mode speeds up the writing of your message.

Press the key once and the word will be modified each time you press a key. As you go on, the word will keep changing.

# 4 Telephone warranty.....

## 16 Troubleshooting .....


Before contacting the service centre, you are advised to follow the instructions below:

- You are advised to fully charge (  ) the battery for optimal operation.
- Avoid storing large amounts of data on your phone as this may affect its performance.
- Use User Data Format <sup>(1)</sup> to perform phone formatting (to perform User Data Format <sup>(1)</sup>, hold down # key while simultaneously pressing the power on/off key under power off mode). ALL User phone data: contacts, messages and files will be lost permanently. It is strongly advised to fully backup the phone data and profile before doing formatting.

### **My phone cannot switch on**

- Check the battery contacts, remove and reinstall your battery, then turn your phone on
- Check the battery power level, charge for at least 20 minutes
- If it still does not work, please use User Data Format <sup>(1)</sup> to reset the phone

### **My phone is frozen or has not responded for several minutes**

- Restart your phone by pressing and holding the  key
- Remove the battery and re-insert it, then restart the phone
- If it still does not work, please use User Data Format <sup>(1)</sup> to reset the phone

### **My phone turns off by itself**

- Make sure power off key is not mis-contacted
- Check the battery charge level
- If it still does not work, please use User Data Format <sup>(1)</sup> to reset the phone



### **My phone cannot charge properly**

- Make sure you are using an ALCATEL ONETOUCH battery and the charger from the box
- Clean the battery contact if it's dirty.
- Make sure your battery is inserted properly before plugging in the charger.
- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; if the battery power is empty for a long time, it may take around 20 minutes to display the battery charger indicator on the screen
- Make sure charging is carried out under normal conditions (0°C to +40°C)
- When abroad, check that the voltage input is compatible


### **My phone cannot connect to a network or “No service” is displayed**

- Try connecting in another location

### **Invalid SIM card**

- Make sure the SIM card has been correctly inserted (see page 13, 14)

- Make sure the service of your SIM card is available

### **Unable to make outgoing calls**

- Make sure you have dialed a valid number and press the  key
- For international calls, check the country and area codes
- Make sure your phone is connected to a network, and the network is not overloaded or unavailable
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)
- Make sure you have not barred outgoing calls (see page 32)
- Make sure that your phone is not in flight mode

### **Unable to receive incoming calls**

- Make sure your phone is switched on and connected to a network (check for overloaded or unavailable network)
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)
- Make sure you have not forwarded incoming calls (see page 32)
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls
- Make sure that your phone is not in flight mode


### **The caller's name/number does not appear when a call is received**

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your operator
- Your caller has concealed his/her name or number

### **I cannot find my contacts**

- Make sure your SIM card is not broken
- Make sure your SIM card is inserted properly
- Import all contacts stored in SIM card to phone

### **The sound quality of the calls is poor**

- You can adjust the volume during a call by pressing the Navigation key (up and down)
- Check the network strength 
- Make sure that the receiver, connector or speaker on your phone is clean

### **I am unable to use the features described in the manual**

- Check with your operator to make sure that your subscription includes this service
- Make sure this feature does not require an ALCATEL ONETOUCH accessory

### **When I select a number from my contacts, the number cannot be dialed**

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file
- Make sure that you have inputted the country prefix when calling a foreign country

### **I am unable to add a contact in my contacts**

- Make sure that your SIM card contacts are not full; delete some files from your SIM card or save the files in the phone contacts

### **My callers are unable to leave messages on my voicemail**

- Contact your network operator to check service availability

### **I cannot access my voicemail**

- Make sure your operator's voicemail number is correctly entered in "Messages\Voicemail"
- Try later if the network is busy

### **The flickering icon is displayed on my standby screen**


- You have saved too many short messages on your SIM card; delete some of them or archive them in the phone memory

### **SIM card PIN locked**

- Contact your network operator to obtain the PUK code (Personal Unblocking Key)

### **How to make your battery last longer**

- Make sure you follow the complete charge time (minimum 3 hours)
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication
- Switch on the backlight upon request
