



Tip: Take care not to scratch or bend the contacts on the memory or SIM card when inserting them into the card holders.





When the battery is running low, is displayed and a warning signal is heard.

- 1. Connect the mains adapter to a wall socket and to the charging socket.
- 2. When the phone is fully charged, is shown.

If the phone is turned off during charging, the phone is still charging. Press the ① Power key to view charging status.

Save energy

When you have fully charged the battery and disconnected the charger from the device, unplug the charger from the wall outlet.

Note! To save power, the display is locked after a while. Press the ① **Power key** to activate the screen.

Turn the phone on and off Turn on the phone

- 1. Press and hold the ① Power key located on the top left until the phone vibrates.
- 2. Enter your SIM card PIN if requested, then select $\stackrel{\checkmark}{\lor}$ to confirm. Select $\stackrel{\checkmark}{\lor}$ to delete character.
- 3. Wait for the phone to start.

Note! When turning on your phone, the installed applications may need to be updated and this can take a few minutes depending on Internet connection. This also requires an Internet connection, preferable use a Wi-Fi connection to reduce data costs.

If the wrong PIN code is entered several times **Enter PUK** is displayed and you need to enter your PUK code (Personal Unblocking Key). Contact your service provider for more information about PIN and PUK code.

See Change PIN code, p.12 for information about changing the PIN code.

Turn off the phone

- 1. Press and hold the ① Power key until the options menu opens.
- In the options menu, select Power off → OK.

Screen lock

The screen lock prevents unwanted actions on the touch screen when you are not using the phone. Your display is locked when left idle for a set period of time, depending on set screen timeout.

Activate and unlock the screen

- 1. Briefly press the (1) Power key.
- 2. Slide $\stackrel{\textcircled{\tiny 1}}{\bigcirc}$ to the right $\stackrel{\textcircled{\tiny 1}}{\bigcirc}$ to unlock.

Lock the screen manually

• Briefly press the (1) Power key.

Startup guide

The first time you turn on your phone, the **Startup guide** is opened. Follow the instructions to start personalising your new Doro Liberto[®] 810.






Zoom/Pinch

- Place two fingers on the screen and pinch them together to zoom out or spread them apart to zoom in. This function is not always applicable.
- If available, select $\stackrel{•}{\hookrightarrow}$ to zoom in or $\stackrel{•}{\hookrightarrow}$ to zoom out.



Sensors

Your device has sensors that detects light and proximity. The sensors adjusts the brightness of the screen, if set to automatic. It also turns the touch screen off during voice calls when your ear is close to the screen to prevent unintentionally activating other functions.



Use the phone keys

- Access options/menu available on the current screen or application. Home key
- Return to the Home screen.
- Press and hold to go to Google[™] search.

Back key 🗲

 Return to the previous screen. Once you are back to the Home screen, you can't go back any further.

Note! To fully close applications, you may need to press \equiv and select **Exit** or similar in the running application.

Home screen

The Home screen is your start screen on your Doro Liberto® 810. Set your favourite picture as wallpaper and add your favourite contacts for quick access. Use the Google™ search bar to quickly find what you are looking for.

Select a saved contact from Contacts.

Change wallpaper

- 1. From the Home screen, select to open the applications list.
- Select Settings → Wallpaper → Change.
- 3. Select a picture from the **Gallery**.

Lock screen

The lock screen is the screen shown when awaking the phone from screen lock. The display shows time and date as well as if you have received any notifications like missed calls or messages.

Applications list

The applications list contains the applications that come pre-installed on your Doro Liberto® 810 and all the applications you install. The applications list extends beyond the regular screen width, so you need to flick left or right to view all content. The numbers at the bottom displays the current part of the applications list.



Status and notifications

The status bar, located at the top of your screen, shows signal strength, ongoing and new applications as well as battery status. You are notified when something new happens, like new message or missed call. The notification panel contains more information and from there you can view notifications about applications or enable quick phone settings like **Wi-Fi** or **Flight mode**. You can also open the **Settings** menu, select


Open the notifications panel

- 1. Drag the status bar downwards:
 - To view updates or information about an application, select it from the Notifications list.
 - To clear the list, select X.
 - To enable or disable connectivity status, select Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, GPS or Flight mode in the top menu.



Close the notifications panel

- At the bottom of the status bar, select and drag upwards.
- Press 🗲.



Enter text (≢

You can enter text, number and other characters using the on-screen keyboard. Select a text field to open the on-screen keyboard.

Activate keyboard

Select the text field.

Select the desired character.

Special characters and numerals

- 1. Select **123** for a list of special characters.
- Select the desired character or select {&= to view additional characters.
- 3. To return, select abc.

Move the cursor within text

Select within the text to move the cursor.

Upper case, lower case

- Select

 in the lower left corner to enter upper or lower case letters.
- To only enter upper case letters, select
 are capitalized.

Smileys

Touch and hold of for a list of smileys.

Change input language

- 1. Touch and hold 123

 Languages & layouts and check the wanted language to enable.
- 2. Press to save and return.

Enter text with predictive text

Start entering text and the dictionary suggests words based on the keys you have selected. Predictive text is enabled by default.

Activate predictive text

- 1. Select the text field.
- 2. Touch and hold 123 Predictions and check the box.
- 3. Press to save and return.

Enter text

- 1. To write the word "Doro", select D, o, r, o.
- 2. Select the suggested word from the list.
 Alternatively, select the space key to keep the selected word and continue with the next word.

Select action when pressing the spacebar

 Touch and hold 123 → Predictions → Spacebar will... and select an option.

Change keyboard

You can select to use a QWERTY or an AZERTY keyboard, depending on selected language, for text input.

- 1. Activate the keyboard by selecting a text field.
- 2. Touch and hold **123** → Languages & layouts.
- 3. If available, select the keyboard icon mext to the selected language.
- 4. Scroll the list and select **QWERTY** or **AZERTY**.
- 5. Press to save and return.

Note! If multiple languages, all languages must support the wanted keyboard.

Phone settings

Display •

Text size

- 1. Open the applications list and select **Settings**.
- 2. Select More settings → Display → Text size → Medium/Large.
- 3. When done, select \bigvee Save.

Brightness

- Open the applications list and select Settings.
- Select Brightness and set Automatic to .
- 3. Drag the slider to adjust the screen brightness. The higher value, the better contrast.
- 4. When done, select \forall Save.

Tip: To save battery, set **Screen brightness** to **Automatic**.

Sound C Audio setup C

If you use a hearing aid or have hearing difficulties when using the telephone in a noisy environment, you can customise the phones audio settings.

- Open the applications list and select Settings.
- 2. Select Sound & Volume Audio setup.
- 3. Select an option:
 - Normal for normal hearing in normal conditions.
 - Medium for mild hearing impairment or use in a noisy environment.
 - High for moderate hearing impairment or use in a very noisy environment.
- 4. When done, select \checkmark Save.

Ringtone

- 1. Open the applications list and select **Settings**.
- 2. Select **Sound & Volume** Ringtone.
- 3. Select a melody in the list.
- 4. When done, select \forall Save.

Volume

- Open the applications list and select Settings.
- 2. Select **Sound & Volume Yolume**.
- 3. Press the volume keys or drag the slider to adjust the tone volume.
- 4. When done, select \checkmark Save.

Tip: You can also press the volume keys to adjust the volume.

Alert type

- 1. Open the applications list and select **Settings**.
- 2. Select **Sound & Volume** → **Alert type**.
- 3. Select an option.
- 4. When done, select \forall Save.

Tip: You can also activate silent mode by press and hold the ① **Power key** and then select Silent mode in the pop-up.

Change PIN code

- 1. Open the applications list and select **Settings**.
- 2. Select More settings

 PIN.
- 3. Enter old PIN and select \checkmark Save.
- 4. Enter new PIN and enter again.
- 5. When done, select \bigvee Save.

PIN code options

- 1. Open the applications list and select **Settings**.
- 2. Select More settings → Security → SIM lock:
 - On to activate PIN code. you need to enter the PIN code every time the phone is started.
 - Off to deactivate PIN code.

WARNING

If the SIM card is lost/stolen it is unprotected.

 Automatic to start the phone without the PIN code. The phone remembers it automatically, but if the SIM card is moved to another phone (lost/stolen) the PIN code needs to be entered when the phone is started.

Change storage location

If you insert a compatible external memory (micro SD card) into your Doro Liberto® 810, it is recommended you change the default storage location. This allows you to save more files on your device, like pictures and videos.

- Open the applications list and select Settings.
- 2. Select More settings Application Storage SD Card.
- 3. When done, select \forall Save.

Note! This option is only available when a compatible external memory is inserted in the device.

Discover Me

Get guided help and discover the basics of your phone.

• Open the applications list and select Discover Me.

Wireless networks (Wi-Fi)

To get the most out of your Doro Liberto® 810, you need Internet access. It is recommended to use Wi-Fi connections when available to reduce costs for data traffic. Contact your service provider for detailed subscription costs before activating.

- 1. Open the applications list and select **Settings**.
- 3. Set $\begin{subarray}{c} \end{subarray}$ to enable. Available networks are displayed in a list. The networks can be open or secured ($\begin{subarray}{c} \end{subarray}$).
- 4. Select a network **Connect**. If secured, enter the password. For more information, contact the relevant network administrator.
- 5. Connected network is highlighted with •.

Tip: Your phone remembers Wi-Fi networks you connect to. If Wi-Fi is turned on, the phone automatically connects to the network next time you are within reach.

Some open networks require you to log in to a web page before gaining access to the network.

To set up data account, see Data connectivity, p.28.

Software update

The software for your Doro Liberto® 810 can be updated in several ways. When a new software is available, a notification message is shown in the status bar. Select it to start downloading. The download may vary depending on Internet connection. Make sure to have an Internet connection, preferable use a Wi-Fi connection to reduce data costs.

Check for software updates

- Open the applications list and select Settings.
- 2. Select More settings → About phone → System update → Check for updates.
- 3. If new update, select **Yes** to start download the installation. If no available software update, select **Close**.
- 4. To start the installation, select **OK**.

Note! During the installation, your phone will be temporarily out of service, even for emergency calls. All contacts, photos, settings, etc. will remain safely stored in the phone. Do not interrupt the installation.

5. Select **OK** to restart your phone. The restart may take a while, when successfully completed use your phone as usual.

Battery performance

Information about your phone, like phone status, battery usage and data usage are found in the **About phone** menu.

- 1. Open the applications list and select **Settings**.
- 2. Select More settings About phone. Improve battery performance
- Charge your phone often, preferable every day. Charging does not affect the lifetime of the battery.
- When not downloading data from the Internet, which is power consuming, disable data connections over mobile networks. Data is still transmitted over wireless networks.
- Turn off Bluetooth and Wi-Fi when not needed. Use the connectivity status in the status bar to disable the features.
- Synchronise your applications manually, like your e-mail, calendar and contacts.
- Use the **Battery usage** menu in your device to see which applications use the most power.
- Lower the screen brightness level. See <u>Phone settings</u>, p.10.
- When in areas with no network coverage, turn off your device or activate the Flight mode. The device repeatedly scans for available networks which consumes power. See Flight mode, p.30.
- Use Doro original handsfree devices to listen to music. Handsfree devices consumes less battery than your device's own loudspeakers.
- Lock the screen when not in use, press the ① Power key and your display goes to sleep. See <u>Screen lock, p.4</u>.

Doro Experience®

Note! You need to have Internet access to use most of the features in Doro Experience. Depending on how you use your phone, it can use up a lot of Internet bandwidth really quickly. Before you use your phone, we strongly recommend that you contact your mobile operator about data rates. Using data services while roaming can be costly. Navigation

To navigate, use the main menu:



Welcome is the start page.



Apps lets you arrange your application icons according to your preferences.



Contacts lets you add, edit or remove your contacts.



Gallery lets you add or remove your pictures.



Account settings shows your personal settings.

Tip: The name of Doro Experience® account holder and the **Log out** option is accessible to the upper right.

Synchronisation

Select when to allow synchronisation with your Doro Experience® account.

App Selection

Personalise your phone with applications specially selected for you. Select the application to download and install it to your phone.

- 1. Open the applications list and select App Selection.
- 2. The applications are divided into:
 - **Categories** to view all applications by category.
 - **Featured** to view all featured applications.
 - New to view the latest available applications.
 - **My applications** to view all applications installed on your phone.

Install applications

- 1. Locate the application and select it to view and to get more information.
- 2. Select **Install**. The application is located in the applications list.
- 3. If needed, when opening the application for the first time, you need to download the application on the phone memory or on the memory card.

Uninstall applications

- 1. Select **My applications** and open the application.
- 2. Select Uninstall and confirm.

Tip: The application can be re-installed, repeat the installation steps.

Google™

To get the most out of your phone, you need to have a Google[™] account. It's a convenient way to manage your phone's applications, contacts, calendar events, reminders and more. You can also back up your information in case you should lose your phone.

Google[™] Play

You need to have a Google[™] account to use **Play Store**.

Browse the available applications and games through different categories or through top lists like Top paid and Top Free. You can also search for a specific application or game.

Some applications needs to be purchased. The cost is shown in the application description as well as if it is free. You pay using Google[™] Wallet, which can be registered when setting up a Google[™] account or the first time for a purchase or by using any other available payment method.

Note! You need an Internet connection to use this service. It is recommended to use Wi-Fi connections when available to reduce costs for data traffic. Contact your service provider for detailed subscription costs before activating.

Create Google[™] account

- Open the applications list and select Play Store.
- Select New and follow the instructions. If you already have an account, select Existing.

Download an application

- 1. Open the applications list and select Play Store.
- 2. Find an item you wish to download by browsing categories or by using the search function.
- 3. Tap the item to view its details, and follow the instructions to complete the installation/purchase.

Note! Read through the **App permissions** carefully before you accept to install.

Tip: All downloaded applications can be found in **My apps**. In Play Store press \equiv and select **My apps**.

Open a downloaded application

Update an installed application

- 1. In Play Store, press \equiv and select **My apps**.
- 2. You can select to update all applications that needs to be updated, select **Update all**, or select a specific application **Update** and confirm.

Delete an installed application

- 1. In Play Store, press \equiv and select **My apps**.
- 2. Select the downloaded application

 Uninstall and confirm.

 Cancel subscription to an application
- 1. In Play Store, press ≡ and select My apps.
- 2. Select the application

 Cancel and confirm.

Calls

Make a call

- 1. From the Home screen, select Phone.
- 2. Enter the phone number including the area code.
- 3. Select Call to dial.
- 4. Select End call to end or cancel.

Tip: For international calls, use the international prefix + before the country code. Touch and hold **0** until + is shown.

Make a call from contacts

1. From the Home screen, select \checkmark Phone \rightarrow Contacts.

You can also open the applications list and select Contacts.

- 2. Scroll the list to find the contact and select **Call**. If needed, select the number to dial.
- 3. Select End call to end.

Receive a call

- 1. Select \checkmark Answer or drag \bullet to the right (\checkmark) .
- 2. Select End call to end.

Call options

Volume control

• Use the volume keys to adjust the sound volume during a call. The volume level is indicated on the display.

Mute

- 1. During a call, select Ψ .
- 2. To disable, select 🥦.

Dialer (tone sending)

- 1. During a call, select
- 2. Enter number.
- 3. To close, select

Loudspeaker

- During a call, select ¥.
- 2. Speak clearly into the microphone at a maximum distance of 1 m. Use + or to adjust the loudspeaker volume.
- To disable, select <

Hold

- 1. During a call, press \equiv and select **II**. On hold is displayed.
- 2. To return to the call, press \equiv and select \triangleright .

Add call

- 1. During a call, press \equiv and select \blacksquare . The first call is set on hold.
- 2. Enter a number or select a saved contact from Contacts.
- 3. Press ≡ and select:

- Swap calls to return to the first call. To swap back to the other call, repeat from step 3. The current number/contact is displayed.
- Merge calls to start a group call. To add more contacts, repeat from step 1.
- **Split** (when in group call) to split the group call. You can then swap between the calls.
- Press End call to end all active calls.

Headset

 Connect a headset to the headset socket. The internal microphone in the phone is automatically disconnected.



CAUTION

Using a headset at high volume may damage your hearing. Adjust the volume level carefully when using a headset.

Call log

- 1. From the Home screen, select Phone To Call log.
- 2. All calls are displayed in the list: Wissed, Cutgoing or Incoming.
- 3. Select a number to: **Call**, **Write**, **Details** or **Add number** and select existing one to be updated or **Add** to add as new contact.

Delete number/s

- 1. Press \equiv and select **Delete**.
- 2. Select the numbers you want to delete $\Rightarrow \forall$ and confirm.

Voice mail

If your subscription includes an answering service, callers can leave a voice mail message when you cannot answer a call. Voice mail is a network service and you may need to subscribe to it first. For more information and for the voice mail number, contact your service provider.

- 1. Open the applications list and select **Settings**.
- 2. Select More settings → Calls → Voice mail → Add.
- 3. Enter name and number.
- 4. When done, select \forall Save.

- 5. Optionally, select:
 - Call to call your voice mail.
 - **Edit** to edit the given information.
 - Delete and confirm to delete the voice mail number.

Tip: From the Home screen, select \checkmark **Phone** \rightarrow **Voice mail** to call your voice mail.

SOS calls

As long as the phone is switched on, you can always make an SOS call. Enter the main local emergency number for your present location and select \bigcirc **Call**.

Some networks accept calls to emergency numbers without a valid SIM card. Contact your service provider for more information.

Add new contact

- 1. Open the applications list and select **Contacts**.
- 2. Select 4 Add.
- 3. Enter name, number(s) including area code and additional wanted information. See Enter text , p.8.
- 4. To add a picture, select **Add picture**:
 - Gallery to select an existing picture.
 - Camera to take a picture with the camera.
- 5. When done, select \bigvee Save.

Edit contact

- 1. Open an existing contact.
- 2. Select Edit.
- 3. Enter updates.
- 4. When done, select \forall Save.

Add favourite

- 1. Open an existing contact.
- 2. Select Add as favourite.

Tip: To remove as favourite, repeat step 1–3 and select **★ Remove favourite**.

Send contact details

- 1. Open an existing contact.
- 2. Press \equiv and select **Share**.
- 3. Compose your message and add recipient. See <u>Create and send</u> messages, p.23.

Delete contact

- 1. Open an existing contact.
- 2. Press \equiv and select **Delete** and confirm.

Import contacts

Your saved contacts on the SIM card are automatically imported to your phone during the first start-up.

From SIM card

- 1. Open the applications list and select Contacts.
- 2. Press \equiv and select **Import** and confirm.

ICE (In Case of Emergency) ♥

In the event of a trauma, it is critical to have this information as early as possible to increase the chances of survival. Add ICE contact to improve your own safety. First responders can access additional information such as medication and next of kin from the victims phone in case of an emergency. All fields are optional, but the more information provided the better.

- 1. Open the applications list and select lacktriangle Contacts lacktriangle ICE.
- 2. Select Edit and enter your medical information.
 - Name
 - Birth enter your date of birth.
 - Height
 - Weight

- Language enter your preferred language.
- **Insurance** enter your insurance provider and policy number.
- Contacts to select a contact and number from contacts.
