Basic safety precautions

Please keep instructions for further use and use only as instructed in this guide. This vacuum cleaner is intended for household use only and NOT for commercial or industrial use

- Only use the vacuum cleaner indoors on dry surfaces and keep the area you're cleaning well lit
- Keep fingers, hair and loose clothing away from moving parts and openings whilst using the vacuum cleaner
- This appliance can be used by

children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision

 Only Vax recommended tools should be used with this vacuum cleaner.



- ✗ Don't use this vacuum cleaner if it has been dropped, damaged or left outdoors
- ➤ Don't run over the power cord or use vacuum cleaner if the power cord or plug is damaged. Please contact our Customer Care Line on: 0844 4128 455 (Mon-Fri: 8.30am to 6.30pm, Sat: 9.00am to 5.00pm)
- ✗ Don't handle the plug or use the vacuum cleaner with wet hands
- ✗ Don't pull or carry this vacuum cleaner by the power cord. Don't use the power cord as a handle,

- pull the power cord around corners, sharp edges or close a door over the power cord. Don't unplug vacuum cleaner by pulling on the power cord
- ✗ Don't vacuum up any flammable or combustible materials (lighter fluid, petrol, kerosene etc.) or use the vacuum cleaner in an area with explosive vapours or liquid
- Don't vacuum up hot coals, cigarette butts, matches or smoking hot burning items or use in an area where there may be harmful fluids (chlorine, bleach, and ammonia drain cleaner)



Don'ts

- ✗ Don't attempt to remove blockages with sharp objects as this may cause damage to your vacuum cleaner
- ✗ Don't vacuum up hard or sharp objects such as glass, nails, screws or coins etc
- ➤ Don't use the vacuum cleaner with incorrect voltage as this may result in damage or injury to the user.

 The correct voltage is listed on the ratings label.



Do's

- ✓ Turn off all controls on the vacuum cleaner before disconnecting or connecting the power cord
- ✓ Always keep the power cord away from the brushes whilst using your vacuum cleaner. After use always wrap the power cord around the cord clips provided
- ✓ Always make sure both the premotor/post motor filters are in place before use
- ✓ Always make sure the brushbar is set to hard floor when using your vacuum on the stairs and take extra care when positioning the vacuum cleaner on the stairs
- ✓ Always switch off the vacuum cleaner before disconnecting or connecting the hose and accessories

- ✓ Keep all openings clear and free from debris as this may affect the airflow/suction
- ✓ Always replace the fuse in the plug with a British 13amp fuse. Always protect the power cable from heated surfaces and open flames
- ✓ Use only CE approved 13amp extension cords, non-approved extension cords may overheat. Care should be taken to arrange the extension cord as it could be a trip hazard
- ✓ Store the vacuum cleaner in a cool, dry area. If filters have been cleaned as per user the guide instructions ensure they are thoroughly dry before storing away.

TurboTool

Initial Setup for normal operation

- 1. Use the base accessories.
- Shortest hose
- Extension tube set to shortest practicable length.
- 2. Clean filters installed.
- **3.** Dust receptacle empty.
- 4. All Bleeds must be closed.
- 5. Variable Power set to Maximum.
- 6. Floor heads/tools set to Carpet Mode for carpet cleaning.
- 7. Mechanical Agitation turned ON for carpet cleaning.
- 8. Floor heads/tools set to Hard Floor Mode for hard floor cleaning.
- 9. Mechanical Agitation turned OFF for hard floor cleaning.



Dirt container release button

Dirt container

Press both buttons at the end of hose and insert into hose entry point.

Assembling your machine

Insert hose grip into telescopic extension tube.

PLEASE READ 'LET'S TALK SAFETY' AT THE BEGINNING BEFORE USE


Press button on telescopic extension tube and adjust to required length.

Insert the other end of the telescopic tube into the floor head.



Carrying your machine

Always use the carry handle to lift and carry your vacuum cleaner. Do not use the dirt container release handle. The dirt container should be locked into place before lifting the vacuum cleaner by the carry handle.



Before you begin cleaning

- Always switch off and unplug the vacuum cleaner before connecting or disconnecting the hose/attachments, or removing and emptying the dirt container.
- The vacuum cleaner is equipped with a thermal cut-out. If for any reason the vacuum cleaner does overheat the thermostat
 will automatically turn the vacuum cleaner off. If this happens, switch the vacuum cleaner off and unplug from electrical
 socket. Remove and empty the dirt container also check the vacuum cleaner for blockages. Allow the vacuum cleaner to
 cool for approximately 1 hour (if you have cleaned the filters please wait 24 hours for the filters to fully dry before putting
 back into the vacuum).
- Filters require cleaning at least every 3 months.
- If the vacuum cleaner is blocked, switch off and unplug before removing the blockage.
- When using the accessories always make sure the brushbar is switched to the off position.

IMPORTANT: The base of the vacuum cleaner should always be positioned flat on the floor when starting and in use. The dirt container should be locked into place before lifting the vacuum cleaner by the carry handle.


Using your machine

Taking care of your machine

How to use



Unwind the power cord. Do not pull further than the yellow marker.



Plug into mains and press the on/off button to switch the machine on.




For use on carpets click rocker switch forward. For use on hard floors click rocker switch back.



Raise brushes for carpets.




Lower brushes for hard floors.



Slide vent cover on hose grip open to reduce suction if required.

Using accessories





Choose an accessory and push onto the telescopic extension tube or hose.



The tool connector must be fitted on the hose when using the TurboTool (some models only).



Emptying and cleaning the dirt container



Lift dirt container release handle. The dirt bin lid will 'pop up'. Remove dirt container.



Hold dirt container over a bin and press dirt release clip on the bottom of the dirt container, allowing dirt and debris to fall out.

Cleaning the shroud



Twist separator anti-clockwise, pull to remove.







Tap the shroud over a bin to remove dirt and debris.





Let's talk technical

Cleaning the pre-motor filter



Lift dirt container release handle. The dirt bin lid will 'pop up'.



Pull tab on pre-motor filter to remove.



Tap the filter over a bin to remove any dirt and debris.



24hr

Rinse the filter under water (40°C Max). Leave to dry for 24 hours before placing back in the machine.

IMPORTANT: The exhaust filter is designed to offer long life with no maintenance. The filter should be checked periodically and when heavily discoloured it should be replaced. Please do not wash, scrub or brush the filter as this will damage the delicate filter media.

Post-motor filter maintenance



Press down the release button on the post-motor filter cover, pull to remove.



Press down tab at the top of the filter and pull to remove.



Check the post-motor filter for discolouration.





Clean the pre-motor filter every time the dirt container is emptied and replace the post-motor filter every 12 months

Slide the locking ring to remove.


Removing blockages from the TurboTool (some models only)

IMPORTANT: Remove accessory from hose or telescopic extension tube before performing maintenance or trouble

Lift and separate the housing.



Using a pair of scissors, cut any hair or debris free from around the brushes.




Line up the tabs on front of housing and push together to refit. Slide locking ring into groove to secure.


Removing blockages from the hose




Remove the hose from the vacuum cleaner and telescopic extension tube. Remove any blockage by inserting a wire coat hanger into the hose.



Storing your machine



Press cord rewind button to retract cord.



Place floor head into parking slot on the back of vacuum cleaner for storage and carrying.

What to do if it goes wrong

Problem

There is an accessory missing

Solution

 Check the 'This pack contains' panel on the box to make sure the part is included with your machine.

Why does my vacuum cleaner have no power?

- The plug may not be fully pushed into the electrical socket.
- Check the fuse in the plug if this needs replacing, always replace with a British 13amp fuse.
- The motor thermostat may have tripped. If this has happened, unplug the vacuum
 cleaner. Remove and empty the dirt container and check the hose for blockages.
 Clean the filters and allow the vacuum cleaner to cool for approximately 1 hour
 (if you have washed the filters you will need to wait 24 hours for the filters to
 fully dry before putting them back into the vacuum cleaner).

Why won't the vacuum cleaner pick up?

- The dirt container may not be correctly fitted, remove the dirt container from the vacuum cleaner and check it's assembled correctly, refit ensuring it's locked into place.
- The filter may be clogged, clean the filter. Go to 'Taking care of your machine'.
- The dirt container may be blocked, empty the dirt container. Go to 'Taking care
 of your machine'.
- There may be a blockage in the hose/tube. Disconnect from the vacuum cleaner and carefully remove any blockages. Go to 'Let's talk technical'.

Why is dust escaping from the vacuum?

• The filters may be clogged, clean the filter. Go to 'Taking care of your machine'.

WARNING: To reduce the risk of personal injury, unplug the vacuum before performing maintenance/troubleshooting checks.
