

Overview of controls (cont)


Due to new ECO regulation requirements this product incorporates a power saving feature.

When in **CD** or **CASSETTE** mode, once audio playback has ceased and the unit has stood idle for approximately **10 minutes** it will switch into a 'power-down' power saving mode.

THIS IS NOT A FAULT.

To wake the unit up, slide the **FUNCTION SWITCH** to **OFF/TAPE** (or any other setting if in **TAPE** mode) and then back to **CD** or **OFF/TAPE**.


NOTE: Wake up will not function if any cassette buttons are depressed. Cancel any buttons before waking.



Installing batteries

The CBBCAS2 unit can be powered by either mains power or battery power. In order to utilise battery power the mains cable must be disconnected from the unit.


- **1:** Push the battery cover clip downwards in the direction indicated, and remove the cover.
- **2:** Fit **6** x C size batteries in the sequence shown, observing polarity. **3:** Refit the battery cover.



NOTE: When left unused for long periods of time using battery power, it is advised to switch the power to the OFF position to avoid battery drainage in STANDBY mode.

Mains power

1: Connect the mains power cable to the MAINS POWER INPUT on the rear of the unit.



2: Connect the mains plug to a UK power source and switch ON.

Radio operation

1: Set the FUNCTION SELECTOR switch to the 'RADIO' position.



BAND

- 2: Select the required band (FM.ST (Stereo), FM or MW) using the BAND SELECTOR switch.
- 3: Rotate the TUNING CONTROL to set the frequency required.
- 4: Adjust the sound level using the VOLUME control.
- 5: To turn off the radio and enter STANDBY mode set the FUNCTION selector switch the OFF/TAPE position.

Radio operation (cont)

 $\operatorname{\textbf{NOTE:}}$ FM frequencies run at the top of the dial & MW (AM) frequencies along the bottom.

- For FM reception: you will need to extend the FM antenna fully, and in some cases move it around until you receive the best possible signal.
- For MW reception: the built-in ferrite antenna is used, meaning to receive the best signal you may need to move the entire unit around until the best signal is found.

Cassette operation

Cassette playback

1: Set the FUNCTION SELECTOR switch to the OFF/TAPE position



- 2: Press the STOP/EJECT button to open the cassette door, insert a cassette into the compartment and close the door.
- **3:** Press the **PLAY** button, and adjust to the required volume level. When the tape comes to the end it will automatically stop and the button will release.
- 4: During playback the cassette can be fast forwarded by pressing down the **FAST FWD** button or rewound with the **REWIND** button. Pressing **STOP/EJECT** will cancel all functions.
- 5: To pause playback of a cassette press the **PAUSE** button, to enable playback press the **PAUSE** button again.
- 6: To eject the cassette press the **STOP/EJECT** button to cancel any functions, then press again to open the cassette compartment door and remove the cassette.

Cassette operation (cont)

Recording from the Radio / CD 1: Set the FUNCTION SELECTOR switch to the RADIO or CD position.



- 2: Tune in the radio station you wish to record (see Radio Operation Page 3), or load a CD (see CD Operation Page 4) Insert a blank (recordable) cassette into the unit.
- 3: Press the RECORD and PLAY button at the same time to start recording.
- **4:** When finished press the **STOP/EJECT** button. or leave the recording until the cassette reaches the end where it will stop automatically.

CD operation

General playback

1: Set the FUNCTION SELECTOR switch to the 'CD' position.



- 2: Open the CD lid using the OPEN/CLOSE latch. Load a compatible disc with the label facing upwards.
- **3:** The unit will scan the disc and then display the total number of tracks on the **LED DISPLAY.**
- 4: Press the CD-PLAY/PAUSE button to begin playback. The current track number will be displayed on the LED DISPLAY and a dot will appear on the display.

CD operation (cont)

- 5: Press the CD-PLAY/PAUSE button once more to pause playback.
- The dot on the display will flash to indicate pause mode is active. Press the **CD-PLAY/PAUSE** button again to resume playback.
- 6: Press the CD-STOP button to stop playback. The LED DISPLAY shows the total number of tracks again.

Skip tracks and search for a specific point to play

- 1: Press the **CD-SKIP+** button once during playback to skip to the next track. To skip to a specific track ahead, press this button several times until you reach the track number required.
- 2: Press the CD-SKIP- button once during playback to return to the beginning of the current track. Press the CD-SKIP- button twice repeatedly to skip to the previous track. To skip back to a specific track, press this button several times.
- **3:** Press and hold the **CD-SKIP+** button during playback to fast forward the current track.
- 4: Press and hold the **CD-SKIP-** button during playback to fast rewind the current track.

Programmed playback

Program an alternative play order of up to 100 tracks follow the below steps.

- 1: Make sure the unit is in STOP mode and not playing a disc.
- 2: Press the CD-PROGRAM button, the display will show '01' flashing.
- 3: Select a track using the CD-SKIP- / CD-SKIP+ buttons. When you have located the track you wish to assign to slot '01' press the CD-PROGRAM button to store and advance to the next slot.
- **4:** Continue programming tracks until you reach the maximum allowed or as many as you require.

- 5: When programming is complete, press the **CD-PLAY/PAUSE** button to begin the programmed playback order. Pressing the **CD-PLAY/PAUSE** button during playback will **PAUSE** the audio.
- 6: Press the CD-STOP button twice to cancel a programmed sequence and return to the default play mode.

Repeat mode CD

To repeat a single track or an entire disc follow the below steps.

1: Press the CD-REPEAT button during or before playback of a disc.



- 2: A dot will appear on the LED DISPLAY to the left of the track number and flash to indicate REPEAT 1 is active (this mode repeats only the current track).
- 3: Press again or twice from default mode will display a static dot to the left of the track number to indicate **REPEAT ALL** is active (this mode plays all tracks on the current disc).
- 4: Pressing the **CD-REPEAT** button once more disables any **REPEAT** modes and resumes default playback.

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Disc handling information

- Do not touch the playback side of the disc.
- Do not attach paper or tape to disc.



- Fingerprints and dust on the disc cause picture and sound deterioration.
- Wipe the disc from the centre outwards with a soft cloth. Always keep the disc
- clean.



- If you cannot wipe off the dust with a soft cloth, wipe the disc lightly with a slightly moistened soft cloth and finish with a dry cloth.
- Do not use any type of solvent such as thinner, benzene, commercially
- available cleaners or antistatic spray for vinyl. It may damage the disc.
- Do not store discs in a place subject to direct sunlight or near heat source.
- Do not store discs in a place subject to moisture and dust such as a bath room or near a humidifier.
- Store discs vertically in a case, stacking or placing object on discs outside or their case may cause warping.

Care & maintenance

- Important: Always unplug the appliance from the power socket during cleaning and maintenance.
- Ensure the unit is switched off and unplugged from any electrical outlet
- Wipe the case with a slightly moist lint free cloth
- Do not use any cleaning fluids containing alcohol, ammonia or abrasives

Care & maintenance (cont)

- Do not spray an aerosol at or near the object
- Do not allow liquids to spill or objects to drop into any openings
- Do not insert sharp items into speaker grills or any other openings
- Always us the original packaging if it is necessary to transport the unit at any time

If the unit is used in a dusty environment, it may be necessary to have the unit serviced at your local dealer periodically. It is not advisable to allow large deposits of dust to accumulate within the unit as it may prevent adequate cooling. Similarly dust deposits which become damp can sometimes lead to electrical problems which may cause severe damage to the delicate electronics within this unit.


Mains plug information

For your convenience a mains plug with a fuse (3 Amp) has been fitted to this appliance. For your safety please observe the following information.

- The unit is designed to operate on AC mains supply 230 volts, 50 Hz.
- The wires in the mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:

BLUE.....NEUTRAL BROWN.....LIVE

• Under no circumstances should Neutral or Live wires be connected to the **'E**' (Earth) terminal.
