

Power source

- The TV should be operated only from a 100-240V AC, 50 Hz outlet.
- Warning: Do not leave your TV in standby or operating mode when you leave your house.

Positioning the TV

• For ventilation, please leave a clear space of at least 10cm all around the TV.



- Do not block the ventilation openings.
- Do not place the TV on sloping or unstable surfaces, the TV may tip over.
- To prevent damage to the TV, do not place any objects on top of the TV.
- Only use the TV in moderate climates.

Power cord and plug

- The power cord plug should be easily accessible. In case of storms and lightning, when going on holiday, or when the TV is not used for a long period of time disconnect the power cord from the mains power socket.
- **Do not** place the TV, furniture, etc. on the power cord or pinch the cord.
- Handle the power cord by the plug, do not unplug the TV by pulling the power cord.
- Never touch the power cord/plug with wet hands as this could cause a short circuit or electric shock.
- Never make a knot in the power cord or tie it with other cords.
- Power cords should be placed in such away that they are not likely to be stepped on or driven over.
- A damaged power cord/plug can cause fire or give you an electric shock. When damaged it must be replaced, this should only be done by qualified personnel.

Moisture and Water

- **Do not** use this TV in a humid or damp place (avoid bathrooms, the sink in the kitchen, and near the washing machine).
- **Do not** expose this TV to rain or water, as this may be dangerous.
- **Do not** place objects filled with liquids, such as flower vases, on top of the TV. Avoid from dripping or splashing.
- If any solid object or liquid falls into the cabinet, unplug the TV and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.

Ventilation

- The slots and openings on the TV set are intended for ventilation and to ensure reliable operation.
- To prevent overheating, these openings must not be blocked or covered in anyway.

Headphone volume

• Excessive sound pressure from earphones and headphones can cause hearing loss, please take care.

Headphone volume

To prevent injury, please make sure TV must be attached to the wall accordingly to the instalation instructions (if the option is available).

LCD Screen

- The LCD screen is a very high technology product with about a million thin film transistors, giving you fine picture details. Occasionally, a few non-active pixels may appear on the screen as a fixed blue, green or red point. Please note that this does not affect the performance of your product.
- Take care not to scratch the screen with fingernails or other hard objects.

Cleaning

- Before cleaning, unplug the TV from the wall socket.
- **Do not** use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Only use a soft, dry cloth.

Batteries

- Warning: Incorrect installation of batteries may cause battery leakage and corrosion, resulting in damage to the remote control.
- Do not mix old and new batteries, or batteries of different types.
- Do not dispose of batteries in a fire.
- **Do not** dispose of batteries with normal household waste, take to a local recycling centre.

Replacement parts

When replacement parts are required, make sure that the service technician has used replacement parts, which are specified by the manufacturer or have the same specifications as the original one. Unauthorised substitutions may result in fire, electrical shock or other hazards.

Servicing







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Installing / Removing the Base Stand

Base Stand Assembly Instruction

- Place the TV with the display side down on a flat surface. Use a cloth to protect. Locate the bottom at the stand.
- 2. Fix the bottom with turning the screw (4PCS)tightly on the stand.






WALL MOUNTING INSTALLATION GUIDELINES

This television can be wall mounted as follows:

- Place the LED LCD Television onto a solid surface. Please place some soft material over the front of the screen to protect it from any damage.
- 2. Remove the screws (4PCS) from the lower part of the television, where the base joins to the TV, and take away the stand (put the stand somewhere safe for future use).



INSTALLATION NOTES

This TV can be connected to an AC 100-240 Volts, 50/60 Hz power supply. Never connect straight to a DC power supply.


Locate the TV in a room where light does not strike the screen directly. Total darkness or a reflection on the screen can cause eyestrain. Soft and indirect lighting is recommended for comfortable viewing.

Allow enough space between the TV and the wall to permit ventilation.

Avoid excessively warm locations to prevent possible damage to the cabinet or premature component failure.

 Use the four screws provided to fix the TV onto a wall mounting bracket (not included) via the four VESA standard holes on the back of the television. Wall-Mounting Screws

Mount the VESA bracket using M4*10 isometric threaded screws (Not Supplied).

Switch the TV between on and standby mode.

2. MMUTE

Mutes and restores your TV sound.

3.0-9 Number Button

Press to select a programme. (ATV / DTV mode)

4. CH.LIST

Display channel list. (ATV / DTV mode)

5. CD

Return to the previous viewing channel. (ATV/ DTV mode)

6. P.MODE

Select picture mode: Dynamic / Standard /Mild / Personal.

7. S.MODE

Select sound mode: Standard / Music / Movie/ Personal.

8. TV.RD

Select TV program or Radio program. (DTV mode).

9. LANG

Select DTV audio language. (DTV mode)

10. SOURCE

Select among the different input signal sources: DTV / ATV / SCART / AV / YPbPr / HDMI / PC / USB.

11. DISPLAY

Display the present screen information such as the current channel and the input source.

12. CH+/-


Select a channel.

13. VOL+/-

Adjust the volume.

14. NICAM

Switch between different audio channels (only applicable when the TV programme has this feature).

Select from the following mode settings: 16:9 / Zoom1 / Zoom2 / Auto / 4:3.

16. SLEEP

Set the TV sleep timer.

Display the EPG (Electronic Program Guide).(DTVmode)

18. ◀▶▲▼

Allows you to navigate the OSD menus and adjust the system settings to your preference.

- Confirm the selection in the OSD menus.
- Display a list of channels saved in the TV tuner memory.

19. MENU

Display the OSD (On Screen Display) menu.

20. EXIT

Exit the OSD (On Screen Display) menu.

Press once to stop. (USB mode)

FAV

Display the Favourite Channel list. (ATV / DTV mode)

22.

Record the current programme. (DTV mode)

- To start the timeshift playback. (DTV mode)



Start the time-shift function. (DTV mode)

26. SUBTITLE

Display the subtitle which is broadcast with the program. (DTV mode)

27. ■ CANCEL

To exit the teletext mode. (ATV / DTV mode)



To reverse playback rapidly. (USB mode)

28. **■** SIZE

To enlarge the picture on the TV in teletext. (ATV / DTV mode)

29. **■ HOLD**

Freezes a multi-page passage on screen in teletext. (ATV / DTV mode)

To skip to the beginning of the next chapter /track / photo. (USB mode)

30. 🗉 INDEX

To select the page number of the index from teletext. (ATV / DTV mode)

31. ■? REVEAL

Reveals hidden information such as the answer to a quiz in teletext. (ATV / DTV mode).




33. Coloured buttons

Accesses the TELETEXT items or channel edit when using Digital / Freeview TV Channels. (ATV / DTV mode)

TV - Control buttons (Right side)



1. VOL- button

Decreases the volume.

2. VOL+ button

Increases the volume.

3. CH-button

Moves down a channel.

4. CH+ button

Moves up a channel.

5. MENU button


Displays the OSD (on screen display) menu.

6. SOURCE button

Press to select among different input signal sources: DTV / ATV / SCART / AV / YPbPr / HDMI / PC / USB .Confirmed the selection on OSD menu.

7. (**也**)button

Turns the TV on when in standby mode or turns the TV off into standby mode.



Aerial connection

Connect the "aerial" or "cable TV" plug to AERIAL INPUT (ANT.) socket located on the back of the TV.

Power connection

Please note: After unpacking, allow the TV to reach ambient room temperature before connecting the TV to the mains power socket.

Connect the power cord plug to the mains power socket.



Remote control - Inserting batteries

Remove the battery cover on the back of the remote control, gently push down and pull backwards at the same time as shown.

Insert two AAA/R3 or equivalent type batteries. Ensure the batteries are inserted the correct way and replace the battery cover.

Note: When the remote control is not going to be used for long periods of time, the batteries should be removed. Otherwise the remote control may be damaged, caused by battery leakage and corrosion.



Switching the TV On and Off

Switching the TV On

With power cord plug connected to the mains power socket and TV in 'Standby' mode.

To switch the TV on from standby mode, either:

a: The Remote control; Press the " o " button.

b: The TV; Press the " $\boldsymbol{\Phi}$ " button at the top of the TV.

Switching the TV Off

Either press the " $_{\mbox{$ \pmb{\vartheta}$}}$ " button on the remote control or press the " $_{\mbox{$ \pmb{\vartheta}$}}$ " button at the top of the TV, the TV will then switch to standby mode.

Operation using TV control buttons


The VOL+/VOL- buttons will function as volume up/down as default. Even if you set other functions for these buttons, the VOL+/VOL- buttons will return to volume control after a short while.

Volume Setting

Press **VOL+/VOL-** buttons to increase or decrease volume.

Programme Selection

Press **CH+/CH-** buttons to select the next or previous programme.



The remote control is designed to control all the functions of the model you selected.

Volume Setting

Press **VOL+** button to increase the volume. Press **VOL-** button to decrease the volume. A volume level scale (slider) will be displayed on the screen.

Programme Selection (Previous or Next Programme)

Press **CH-** button to select the previous programme. Press **CH+** button to select the next programme.

Programme Selection (Direct Access)

Press number buttons on the remote control to select programmes between 0 and 9. The TV will switch to the selected programme.

Initial setup

- 1. Connect one end of the RF coaxial cable to the aerial socket on the wall and the other end of the cable to the RF (75 Ω) socket at the bottom of your TV .
- 2. Connect the mains cable to the mains socket after you have completed all the connections.
- 3. With power cord plug connected to the mains power socket and TV in 'Standby' mode. At this stage, the TV switches to standby mode. The red LED indicator will illuminate on the front panel of the TV.
- 4. In standby mode, press the button **Φ** on the top of the TV or the **Φ** button on the remote control to turn the TV on. The red LED indicator will turn blue.
- 5. The first time you turn the TV on, it will go straight into **First Time Setup** menu. Press the ▲▼ ◀▶ buttons to navigate the menu and change the settings.



OSD Language

Selects your desired language to be displayed on the menu. The default on-screen menu language is set as English.

Mode Setting

Selects your desired mode setting.

- Home Mode: Viewing at home.
- Store Mode: For store demo, the brightness is higher than home mode.

Country

Selects the country where you will operate the TV. The default country is set as UK.

Auto Scan

Selects the auto scan type: DTV+ATV / DTV /ATV.

Initial setup

Start

Press the **OK** button to start auto tuning. Auto Scan will commence. The display will show the progress of the tuning and the number of channels found.



6. If you want to skip the DTV tuning, press the **MENU** button to interrupt the tuning half way. You will then go straight to ATV tuning. You may repeat the above step if you also want to skip the ATV tuning.

General operation

Press the **SOURCE** button on the remote control and select DTV to switch the TV to Digital Terrestrial Television Broadcasting.

Information Banner

Whenever you change channel using the CH+/ CH-buttons or the number buttons, the TV displays the broadcast picture along with an information banner on the top left of the screen (available only in DTV/ATV mode).

The information banner can be displayed at any time while watching TV by pressing the **DISPLAY** button on the remote control.





Connections

You'll be up and running in no time

Left side connections explained

1. HDMI Input

Connects a device that has an HDMI socket. The TV can display High Definition pictures from devices such as a High Definition Satellite Receiver or DVD Player. These devices must be connected via the HDMI sockets or Component Socket. No sound connection is needed for an HDMI to HDMI connection.

2. USB Input

To connect devices to the TV, providing fast data exchange. USB will have function in USB/DTV mode.

3. YPbPr

YPbPr Input socket is just suitable for YPbPr Mini Cable.


Connect to a DVD player, Digital Set-Top-Box, or other AV devices with component (YPbPr) video output sockets.


4. **AV**

Connect to the composite VIDEO and AUDIO (L/R) output sockets on external video devices.

5. CI Slot

Used to insert a CI card. A CI card allows you to view all the channels that you subscribe to. For more information, see "Conditional Access" section.







Connections

Left side connections explained

6. Headphone jack

To connect an external headphone to the TV. Connect to the HEADPHONE jack to listen to the TV from headphones.

Note: Headphone volume can be changed using "VOL+" or "VOL-" buttons.

7. PC Input (VGA) / PC AUDIO

Connects a personal computer to the TV. Connect the PC cable between the PC INPUT on the TV and the PC output on the PC.

Note:If you connect a device to the TV via the PC cable, you should also use an audio cable to connect your device to the PC AUDIO INPUT to enable audio.

8. SCART socket

Inputs or outputs for external devices Connect the SCART cable between the SCART socket on the TV and the SCART socket on the external device (decoder, VCR or DVD player).

Note: If an external device is connected via the SCART socket, the TV will automatically switch to SCART mode.

9. COAXIAL


To connect to the audio socket on the digital/standard 5.1 audio system.

10. DTV/TV Input (ANT.)

Connects to aerial (antenna) or cable TV. If you use a decoder or a media recorder, you should connect the aerial cable through the device to the TV with an appropriate aerial cable.

11. OPTICAL

To connect to the audio socket on the digital/standard 5.1 audio system.

HDMI Connections


HDMI lets you enjoy high definition digital images and high quality sound by connecting the TV to external devices such as DVD players, set top boxes or gaming equipment.

Power off both the TV and the device before making any connections.

For more information, refer to your device's own instruction book.

When connecting, switch "Source" to "**HDMI**". See, "Input Selection" section.

Note: HDMI cable is not supplied.




SCART Connections

Most devices support SCART connection. You can connect a DVD recorder, VCR or decoder to the TV using the SCART socket.

Power off both the TV and the device before making any connections.

For more information, refer to your device's own instruction book.

Note: The Scart cable is not supplied.



VGA Connections

You can connect a computer (PC) to the TV to display your computer's screen image on the TV.


Power off both computer and TV before making any connections.

Use a 15-pin D-sub display cable to connect a PC to the TV. Use an audio cable between PC AUDIO inputs on the left side of the TV and audio output on your PC to enable sound connection.

When the connection is made, switch "Source" to "PC". See "Input selection" section.

Set the resolution that suits your viewing requirements. Resolution information can be found in the "Appendix parts".

Note: The VGA cable is not supplied.





Let's get started

How to navigate menus - Selecting source

- Press the SOURCE button on the top of the TV or the SOURCE button on the remote control to display the Input source list.
- Press the ▲▼ buttons to select the input source that you want:DTV / ATV / SCART/ AV / YPbPr / HDMI / PC / USB.
- 3. Press **OK** button to comfirm your selection.



How to navigate menus - Selecting source

This system has an Electronic Programme Guide (EPG) to help you navigate through all the possible viewing options.

The EPG supplies information such as programme listings, start and end times for all available services. In addition, detailed information about the programme is often available in the EPG (the availability and amount of programme information will vary, depending on the particular broadcaster).

This function can be used only when the EPG information is broadcast by broadcasting companies.

The EPG displays the programme details for the next 7 days.

1. Press the **EPG** button to switch on EPG.



2. Press **EPG** button or **EXIT** button again to switch off EPG and return to normal TV viewing.

Info bar commands:

RED (PrevDate)

Press the **RED** button to view the schedule of the previous day.

GREEN (NextDate)

Press the GREEN button to view the schedule of the next day.

YELLOW (Schedule)

Press the **YELLOW** button to view the preset reminders in the schedule list. Press the **YELLOW** button to return to the EPG.

BLUE (Reminder)

Press the **BLUE** button while on the selected programme, the Reminder setting menu will be displayed.

Press the buttons ▲▼◀▶ to adjust the settings and then press the Save button to confirm the settings. After confirmation, the EPG Schedule List will then be displayed with your preset reminders shown. Press the YELLOW button to return to the EPG. The TV will automatically tune to the selected programme when it starts.

Let's get started

Teletext (ATV mode)

Teletext is a free service broadcast by some TV stations which gives up-to-the-minute information on news, weather, television programmes, share prices and many other topics. Using the Teletext control buttons you can view pages of information that are listed in the teletext index.

To Turn on Teletext Function



In ATV mode, press the **TTX** button to enter Teletext mode. Press the INDEX button to display the index page.

Press the TTX button once to exit and the TV will return to the channel you were watching.

To select a page of text

Find the number of the page in the index and enter it using the 0-9 buttons. The number of the page will appear on the top left corner of the screen.

The page counter will search for your page. When it finds it, the page will be displayed.

To move to the next page of text, press the ▲ button.

To move to the previous page, press the ▼button.

To return to the index page, enter the "100" by using the 0-9 buttons or press the INDEX button.

Mix

To view a page of text while watching a TV programme, press the TTX button twice. The text will be superimposed over the TV programme.

Double height text

If you have difficulty reading the text on the TV you can double the height of the text.

Press the SIZE button. The top half of the page will be displayed in double height text.

Press the SIZE button again. The bottom half of the page will be displayed in double height text.

Press the SIZE button again to return to the full page.

Page HOLD

If the page of text you have selected contains subpages, these subpages will automatically be displayed in order with a delay to allow you to have enough time to read the page.

To stop the movie to the next sub page, press the **≡\$** HOLD button.

To continue moving through the sub pages, press the **HOLD** button again.

Alternative: Press the SUBPAGE button, and then use the 0-9 buttons to enter a 4-digit page number.

To Reveal Information

Press the Press the REVEAL button to reveal concealed information (quiz answers etc.).

Press the REVEAL button again to conceal the information again.

Fasttext

At the bottom of the teletext screen is a row of subject headings in red, green, yellow and blue.

The remote control has a row of colour buttons corresponding to the row of coloured subjects on the screen.

Pressing one of the colour buttons will take you directly to the page corresponding to the subject heading.

Let's get started

Digital Teletext (DTV mode)

Digital teletext can access special digital teletext services and specific services which broadcast digital teletext. You will need to turn off Subtitle Function before using teletext.

1. In DTV mode, press the TTX button to display the teletext page.



- 2. Press the **0-9** buttons to select a page number.
- Follow the instructions on digital teletext and move onto the next step by pressing OK, ▲▼◀▶, RED,
 GREEN, YELLOW. BLUE or 0-9 buttons etc.
- To change digital teletext service, select a different service by pressing the 0-9 buttons ▲▼ or the buttons.

Alternative: You may press the **RED** button to the **TTX** button to display the teletext information when you see a • red logo displayed on the screen (e.g. BBC).

5. Press the TTX button to exit.

Time Shift Function (DTV mode)

This function allows the TV to virtually record the live viewing broadcast programme.

Note: If the transfer rate of the USB storage device is too slow for recording or time shift function, a warning statement will be shown on the screen. If this happens, please upgrade your USB storage device.



Time Shift Mode and Recording functions may not work if the signal strength is weak.
Stop the time-shift function before switching to another input source.

During normal TV viewing, you may press the **TIMESHIFT** button to virtually pause the live viewing broadcast programme if you want to go out for a while (e.g. going to the bathroom / kitchen). "II " will show on the screen.

When you have returned, press the ►IIbutton to display the PVR Time Shift progress bar and then press the ◀► buttons to select "►" on the bar. Press the OK button to play the missed broadcast programme. "►" will show on the screen.

The video and sound may have a little bit of delay or be out-of-sync for a few seconds

when the unit starts to playback the missed broadcast programme. It will soon turn to normal.



The 'PVR Time Shift Progress Bar'

- 1 Indicates the status of the currently displayed video (►/II/◀/►)
- 2 Indicates the time lagging behind the live broadcast (PVR reviewing)
- 3 Indicates the available recording

Digital Teletext (DTV mode)

Using the Remote Control

You can shift playback to any point of the virtually recorded programme. Press the TIMESHIFT button to display the PVR Time Shift progress bar again.

TIMESHIFT

During playback, press the TIMESHIFT button to display a still screen

When playing

- Press the ◀ button repeatedly to speed up ◀ x 2 / x 4 / x 8 / x 16.
- Press the
 button repeatedly to speed up
 x 2 / x 4 / x8/x16.
- During fast forward / fast backward state, press the ►II button to return to normal playback.

- Press the ▶ button to jump about 10% forward.
- Press the

 → button to jump about 10% back.

- During playback, press the ►II button to display a still screen and then press the ►II button again to resume playback.
- During fast forward / fast backward state, press the ►II button to return to normal playback.

7. Press the **EXIT** button to return to the previous menu.

Plug replacement - UK and Ireland only

Should you need to replace the plug; the wires in the power cable are coloured in the following way:

Blue - Neutral 'N'


Brown - Live 'L'

As the colours of the wires in the power cable may not correspond with the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug, and proceed as follows:

The blue wire must be connected to the terminal that is marked with the letter N.

The brown wire must be connected to the terminal that is marked with the letter L.

If the power lead is damaged, it must be replaced by a qualified electrician.



Energy label

This is called the product Fiche – the information needs to be presented in the following order, also this maybe in the form of a copy of the label, in colour or black and white – the label however must display all the information below:

- Supplier's name or trade mark
- Supplier's model product model no.
- The energy efficiency class of the model
- The visible screen diagonal in centimetres and in inches
- The on-mode power consumption
- The annual energy consumption
- The screen resolution in physical horizontal and vertical pixel count

Trouble shooting

Image persistence - ghosting

Please note that ghosting may occur while displaying a persistent image (still or paused image). LCD TVs' image persistence may disappear after a short time. Try turning off the TV for a while. To avoid this, do not leave the screen in still picture mode for extended periods.

No power

If your TV has no power, please check the power cord plug is connect to the mains power socket.

Poor picture

- 1. Have you selected the correct TV system?
- 2. Is your TV or house aerial located too close to a non-earthed audio equipment or neon lights, etc.?
- 3. Mountains or high buildings can cause double pictures or ghost images. Sometimes you can improve the picture quality by changing the direction of the aerial. Is the picture or teletext unrecognisable?
- 4. Check if you have entered the correct frequency.
- 5. Please retune the channels.
- 6. The picture quality may degrade when two devices are connected to the TV at the same time. In such a case, disconnect one of the devices.

No picture

- 1. No Picture means that your TV is not receiving a transmission. Have you selected the correct button on the remote control? Try once more. Also make sure the correct input source has been selected.
- 2. Is the aerial connected properly?
- 3. Are the plugs connected tightly to the aerial socket?
- 4. Is the aerial cable damaged?
- 5. Are suitable plugs used to connect the aerial?
- 6. If you are in doubt, consult your dealer.

No sound

- 1. Has the TV been set to mute? To cancel mute, press the "

 " button, or increase the volume level.
- 2. Sound is coming from only one speaker. Is the balance set to one extreme?

Remote control - does not operatea

Your TV no longer responds to the remote control. The batteries may be exhausted, if so you can still use the control buttons on the left side of the TV.

Input sources - can not be selected

- 1. If you cannot select an input source, it is possible that no device is connected.
- 2. Check the AV cables and connections if you have tried to connect a device.

The Disc does not play

- 1. No disc in the machine Place a disc into the loader.
- 2. Disc is incorrectly loaded Ensure that the DVD disc is in the loader with the label facing you when looking at the TV screen.
- 3. Wrong type of disc. The DVD player cannot play CD-ROMS etc..
- 4. The region code of the DVD disc must match the player.

Wrong OSD language

- 1. Select the language in the setup menu.
- 2. The language for the sound or subtitles on a DVD disc cannot be changed.
- 3. Multilingual sound and/or subtitles are not recorded on the DVD disc.
- 4. Try to change the sound or subtitles using DVD's title menu. Some DVD's do not allow the user to change these settings without using the disc's menu.

Definition of terms

Angle

Recorded onto some DVD discs are scenes, which have been simultaneously shot from a number of different angles (the same scene is shot from the front, from the left side, from the right side, etc.). With such discs, the ANGLE button can be used to view the scene from different angles.

Chapter Number

These numbers are recorded on DVD discs. A title is subdivided into many sections, each of which are numberd, and specific parts of video persentations can be searched quickly using these numbers.

Chapter Number

This refers to a high-density optical disc on which highquality pictures and sound have been recordedm by means of digital signals. Incorporating a new video compression technology (MPEG II) and high-density recording technology. DVD discs enables aesthetically pleasing fullmotion video to be recorded over long period of time (for instance, a whole movie can be recorded).

DVD discs have a structure consisting of two 0.6mm thin discs, which are adhered to each other. Since the thinner the disc, the higher the density at which the information can be recorded, a DVD disc has a greater capacity than a single 1.2mm thick disc. Since the two thin discs are adhered to each other, there is the potential to achieve doule-sided play sometime in the future for even longer duration play.

Subtitles

These are lines of text appearing at the bottom of the screen, which translate or transcribe the dialogue.

They are recorded on the DVD discs.

Time Number

This indicates the playtime, which has elapsed from the start of a disc or a titile. It can be used to find a specific feature to be used. Availability is determined by the disc's manufacturer.)

Title Number

These numbers are recorded on DVD discs. When a disc contains two or more movies, these movies are numbered as title 1, title 2, etc.

Track Number

These numbers are assigned to the tracks, which are recorded on Audio CDs. They enable specific tracks to be located quickly.

LPCM

LPCM stands for Pulse Code Modulation and is digital audio.

MPEG

Short for Moving Picture Experts Group. This is an international standard for compression of moving images. On some DVDs digital audio has been compressed and recorded in this format.
