Connection

Please consider carefully where your boombox will be situated and make sure that it is:

- on a flat and stable surface
- within a power socket
- where you can fully extend the wire radio aerial
- at least 1 metre away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference.

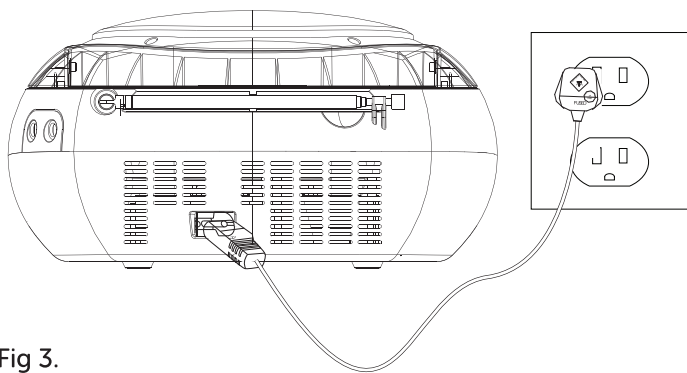

1. Unwind the power cable from the back of the boombox.
2. Extend the wire radio aerial. A vertical position is recommended for maximum signal strength.
3. Plug the mains power plug into the mains power wall socket and switch on (Fig3) .

POWER SUPPLY

USING AC

Before use, check that the rated voltage of your unit matches your local voltage.

Note: Plug is used as the disconnect device.

The disconnect device shall remain readily operable.

USING BATTERIES

Disconnect the AC power cord from the AC inlet of the unit. Battery power is cut automatically by the cord while it is connected.

When the volume decrease, or the sound distorts, replace all of the batteries with new ones.

Insert 6 x 1.5V (R14/UM2/C) batteries.

Attention should be drawn to be the environmental aspects of battery disposal. Batteries shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.

CAUTION! The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and that no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.

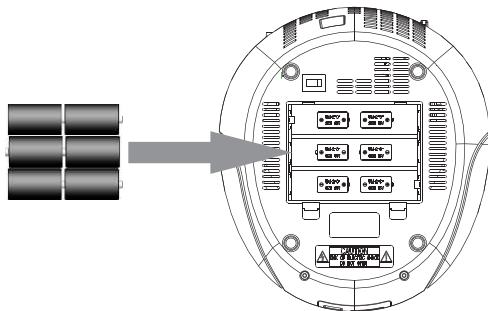

System setting when FM/DAB/AUX mode:

1. Press and hold MENU button, you can press SKP-/ + buttons to select Scan setting / Audio setting / System.
2. Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select System setting.
3. Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select Equaliser setting (from Rock / Speech / My EQ / Normal / Classic / Pop / Jazz), press ENTER button to confirm current operation.
4. Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select Backlight setting (from Timeout / On level / Dim level), press ENTER button to confirm current operation.
5. Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select Language setting (from English / Francais / Deutsch / Italiano), press ENTER button to confirm current operation.
6. Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select Factory Reset setting (YES or NO), press ENTER button to confirm current operation.
7. Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select Software Upgrade setting (YES or NO), press ENTER button to confirm current operation.
8. Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select SW version to show version name.

Listen to music / radio through headphones or earphones

There is a headphone jack next to the AUX jack. Insert the headphone/earphone plug of headphone or earphone into this jack and enjoy music or the radio in private.

Play other audio devices through our set

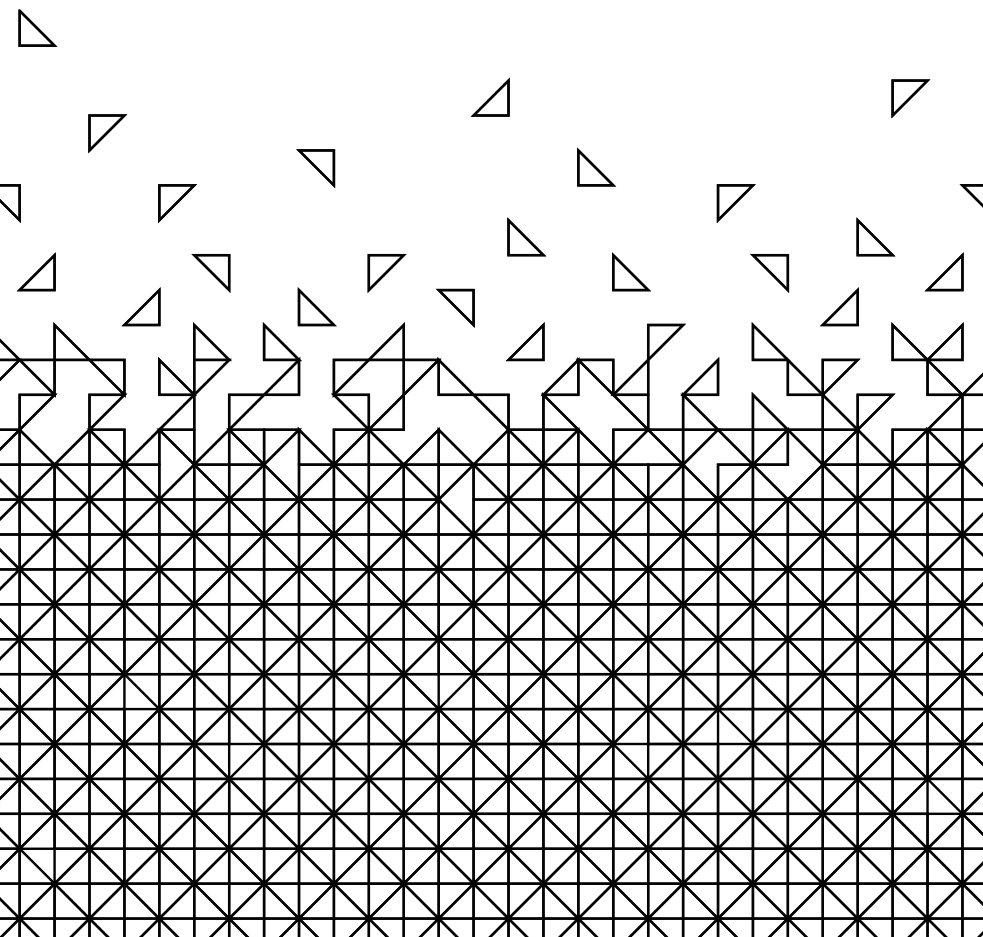
You can enjoy the music of a digital MP3 player, computer or any other external audio device (with a 3.5mm stereo jack) through the set.

1. Insert an audio cable (not included) with 3.5mm plug on each end into the HEADPHONES jack or LINE OUT jack of your MP3 player or computer, and the other end into the AUX-IN jack of the set. This cable is available in any electronic store.
2. Connect the supplied AC power cord or batteries.
3. Press the FUNCTION switch to select AUX (Auxiliary Input) mode.
4. Turn on your MP3 player or computer, adjust the VOLUME control of the MP3 player/computer and the set to the desired level.
5. Press STANDBY button to standby mode.

OPERATION

Listening to Music CD Disc

1. Insert the main plug into a main supply power outlet.
2. Press Function switch to CD mode, "CD" will show on the LCD display.
3. To open the CD door by lifting the Open/Close area near the CD door. Insert disc into the disc compartment with the title side upwards.
4. The total playing track number will show on the LCD display, press the PLAY/PAUSE button to play the CD disc.
5. Press SKIP+ button or SKIP- button to jump to next or previous track.
6. Press and hold SKIP+ button or SKIP- button to search rapidly within a track to locate a specific passage.
7. During CD play, press the PLAY/PAUSE button to pause CD playing and press again to resume.
8. Press the STOP button to stop the CD playing, and total number of track will show on the LCD display.
9. After all tracks have been played, the CD player will stop automatically, and total number of track will also show on the LCD display.

NOTES:

Do not open the CD compartment while the disc is playing or rotating.

This unit can play Music CD Disc format.

REPEAT 1/ REPEAT ALL

1. During CD playback, press SKIP FORWARD button / SKIP BACKWARD button to select a track you wish to repeat.
2. Press the REPEAT button a first time, you can see "REPEAT ONE" showed on the display for a short time, unit will play the desired track repeatedly.
3. To cancel the setting, press the REPEAT button until the "REPEAT OFF" appear on the LCD display.
4. During CD playback, press REPEAT button continuously until the "REPEAT ALL" appear on the LCD display. The unit will play all the tracks on the disc **repeatedly**.
5. To cancel the setting, press the REPEAT button continuously until the "REPEAT OFF" appear on the LCD display.

Random Playback setting

1. Press RAND button until "Random On" appear on the display, Press the RAND button again to play CD music in randomly.
2. Press RAND button until "Random Off" appear on the display, Press the RAND button again to **cancel** playing CD music in randomly.

To Program Specific Tracks (up to 20 Tracks)

1. Load the CD you wish to program.
2. Press STOP button to make sure the CD is in stop mode.
3. Press the MEM button once, "P01" will show on the LCD display.
4. Press the SKIP- button / SKIP+ button until the desired track number is reached.
5. Press the MEM button to store the selection.

6. Press the MEM button again, to browse the programmed tracks. Press the MEM button once time to choose **program** position and you can revised the programmed track or **program** new track.
7. Repeat (4) & (5) steps until you have entered all the tracks.
8. After all memory tracks have been played, the CD player will stop automatically.

To Repeat Programmed tracks

1. During program play, press REPEAT button once will repeat the specifically programmed track.
2. Press REPEAT button again will repeat all the programmed tracks, "REPEAT ALL" show on the display.
3. Press REPEAT button until "REPEAT OFF" show on the LCD display, it will cancel repeat play on programmed tracks.

Listening to the FM Radio

1. Insert the main plug into a main supply power outlet.
2. Press the Function switch to select FM radio position, "FM" will show on the LCD display.
3. Press the TUN-/+ buttons to change the frequency in 0.05MHz steps. Press and hold the TUN- button to scan forward FM frequency, press and hold the TUN+ button to scan backward FM frequency.
4. Press SCAN button to start the channel search. The radio stops if a station signal is received.
5. Press the VOL- or VOL+ button to the desire volume sound.
6. Press INFO button to change the type of information show on the display (frequency/audio status/time/date).
7. Press STANDBY button to turn off radio mode and unit in STANDBY mode.

To obtain the best FM reception, fully extend the FM antenna. Avoid close proximity to the speakers and other electrical appliance.

Listening to the DAB Radio

1. Insert the main plug into a main supply power outlet. And fully extend the telescopic antenna.
2. Short press the STANDBY button to Function selection.
3. Press the Function switch to select DAB radio position, "DAB" will show on the LCD display. When the radio is switched on for the first time, it will automatically do a full scan of DAB station.
4. Press the TUN-/+ buttons in DAB mode to navigate available DAB stations.
5. In order to make new DAB station, Press SCAN button to start a full scan of DAB channels to search for available stations.
6. Press the VOL- or VOL+ button to the desire volume sound.
7. Press INFO button to change the type of information show on the display (frequency /date).
8. Press STANDBY button to turn off radio mode and unit in STANDBY mode.

Noe: If there is no DAB reception at any time, change the position of the unit or adjust the antenna. Press SCAN button to start a new search.

Storing FM or DAB stations

You can store up to 10 pre-set FM stations or DAB stations.

1. Select a FM or DAB station.
2. Press and hold the MEM button, "Preset Store" will show on the LCD display.
3. Press SKIP-/+ buttons to select the preset position, then press ENTER button to save the station to the desired preset.
4. Repeat steps 1-3 to store more FM or DAB station.

NOTE: This unit can store 10 stations for FM and 10 stations for DAB.

Selecting pre-set FM or DAB stations

1. When unit in FM or DAB mode, press MEM button, "Preset Recall" will appear on the LCD display.
2. Press the SKIP-/+ buttons to navigate through the preset FM or DAB stations, and press ENTER button to recall the current preset station.

GENERAL MANUAL SETTING

FM mode:

1. Press and hold MENU button, you can press SKP-/ + buttons to select Scan setting / Audio setting / System.
2. Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select Scan setting from All stations or Strong stations only and press ENTER to confirm setting.
3. Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select Audio setting from Stereo allowed or Force mono and press ENTER to confirm setting.

DAB mode:

1. Press and hold MENU button, you can press SKP-/ + buttons to select Full scan / Manual tune / DRC / Prune / System setting.
2. Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select Full scan setting.
3. Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select Manual tune the DAB station.
4. Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select DRC (Dynamic range compression) , Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select high or low or off status. This function reduces the difference between the loudest and quietest audio being broadcast. Effectively, this makes quiet sounds comparatively louder, and loud sounds comparatively quieter.
NOTE: DRC only works if it is enabled by the broadcaster for a specific station.
5. Press SKP-/ + buttons and press ENTER button to select whether Prune station (yes or no).

Remove a CD

- (1) Lift up the lid of the CD player on the front edge, where is a scooped recess.
- (2) Put your thumb on the central spindle and put your fingers under the outside edge of the CD and lift off and remove the CD from the compartment.
- (3) Close the lid of the CD player.

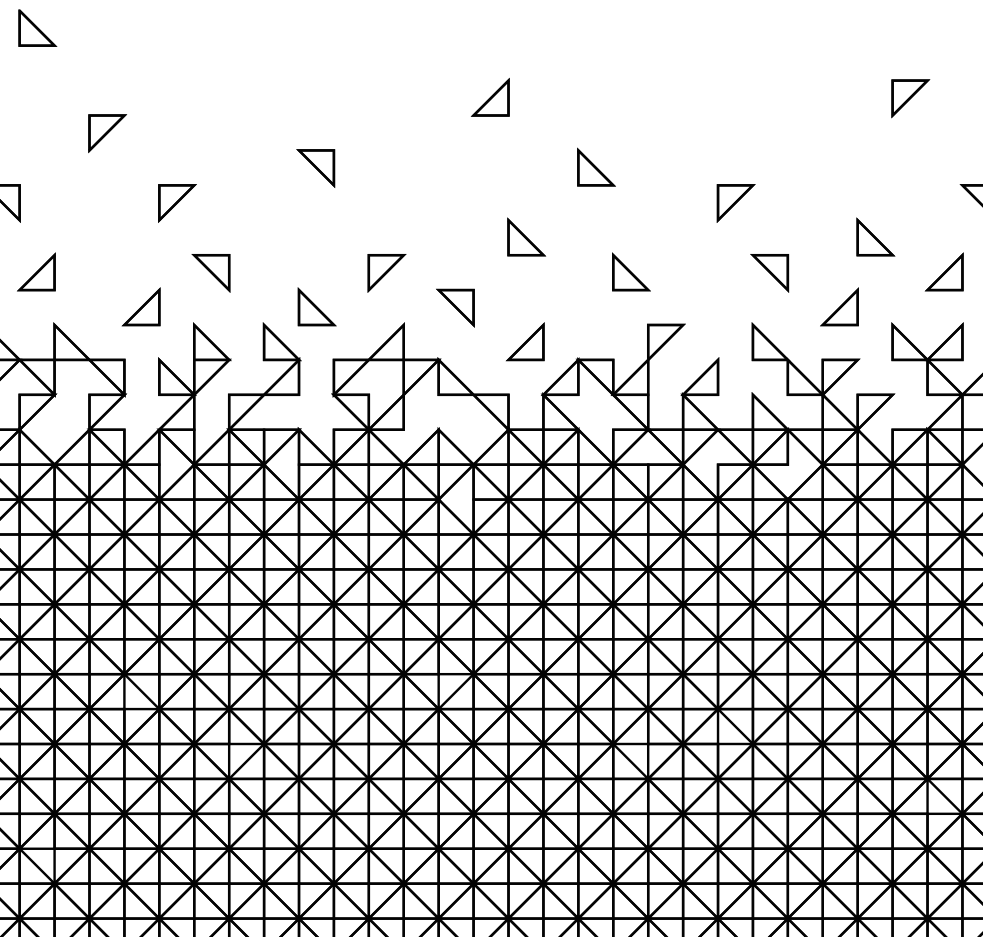
Caring for CDs

- (1) Do NOT touch the playback side of the CD.
- (2) Do NOT attach paper or tape or any other material to the disc.
- (3) Fingerprints and dust on the disc will cause sound deterioration. Wipe the disc from the centre outwards with a soft cloth. Always keep the disc clean.
- (4) If dust or marks cannot be removed with a soft cloth, wipe the disc lightly with a slightly damp soft cloth and then wipe with a soft dry cloth.
- (5) Do NOT use any type of solvent, commercially available cleaners or antistatic spray for vinyl as it may damage the disc.
- (6) Do NOT store discs in places subject to direct sunlight or near a heat source.
- (7) Do NOT store discs in a place subject to moisture or dust, such as a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- (8) Always store discs vertically in a case, stacking or placing objects on discs may cause warping.

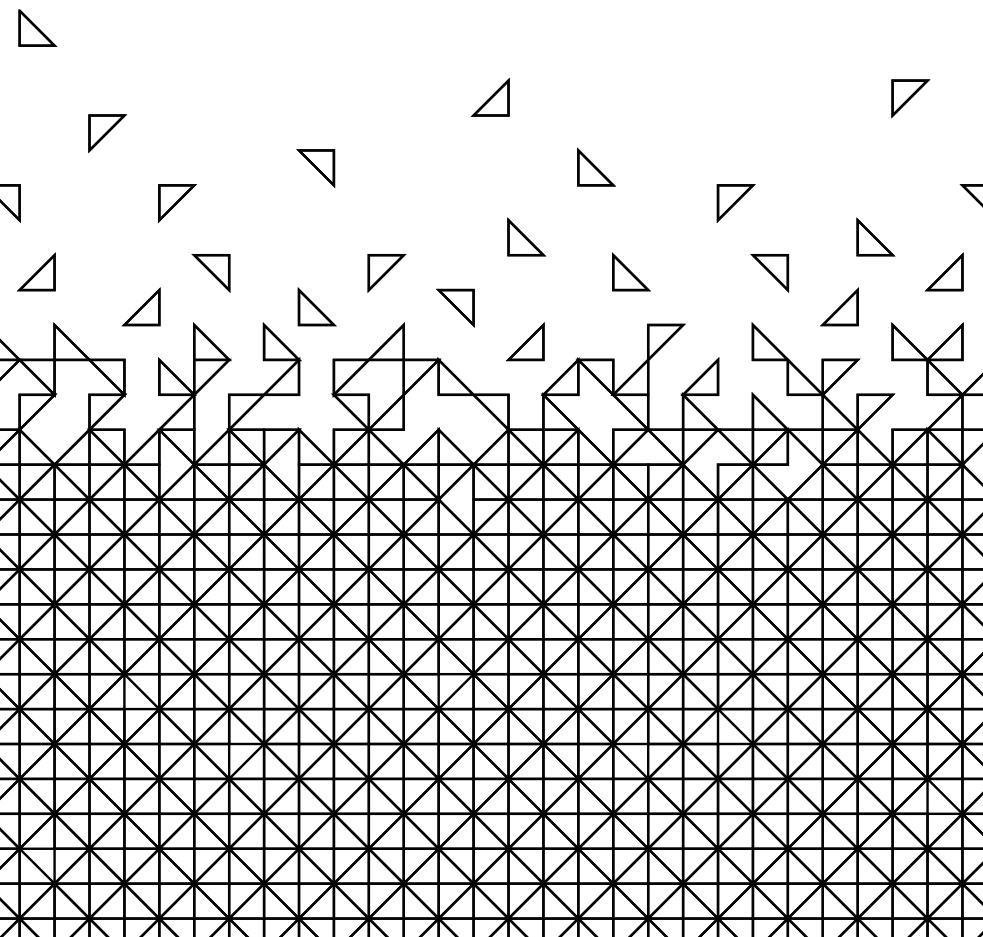

Troubleshooting

CD does not play

- (1) Check that you are in CD mode. If you are not already in CD mode, press STANDBY button to function select status, then press the FUNCTION button to select CD mode.
- (2) When unit in CD mode, you can see the total number of the tracks, please press PLAY/PAUSE button to play the CD disc.
- (3) Take out the CD and check that it is not marked or scatched. Damaged CDs cannot be played in the CD boombox or may skip or not roate correctly in the CD compartment.
- (4) Please check that you are using an original audio CD and not a copy. Often copied CDs will not play.

The function buttons do not respond.

- (1) Check that mains power wall socket is switched on.
- (2) Check that power cord plug inserted into the AC socket of the unit fully.
- (3) Check that you are trying to use the function buttons for the mode that you are in.
- (4) If you are using batteries, they may be exhausted and need to be replaced.
- (5) If you are using mains power, unplug the mains unplug the mains power. Leave the boombox for 3 minutes and then reconnect the power.

Radio reception is poor.

- (1) Check that you have extended the wire radio aerial in a vertical position.
- (2) Press SCAN button or TUN+/- button to tune radio station.
- (3) Check there are no other electrical appliances within 1 metre of your boombox, which may be causing interference.
- (4) Try moving your boombox to another location.
