

## Safety and Care Advice

### Important - Please read these instructions fully before starting assembly

- Check you have all the components and tools listed on the following pages.
- Remove all fittings from the plastic bags and separate them into their groups.
- Keep children and animals away from the work area, small parts could choke if swallowed.
- Make sure you have enough space to layout the parts before starting.

- During assembly do not stand or put weight on the product, this could cause damage.
- Assemble the item as close to its final position (in the same room) as possible.
- Assemble on a soft level surface to avoid damaging the unit or your floor.
- Parts of the assembly will be easier with 2 people.



• To redure the likelihood of damaging your product please ensure that your

power drill is set on a low torque setting.

#### Care and maintenance

- Only clean using a damp cloth and mild detergent, do not use bleach or abrasive cleaners.
- From time to time check that there are no loose screws on this unit.
- This product should not be discarded with household waste.
  Take to your local authority waste disposal centre.

### **Handy Hints**


- Assemble all parts and bolts loosely during assembly, only once the product is complete should you fully tighten the bolts.
- Regularly check and ensure that all bolts and fittings are tightened properly.






## Ruler - Use this ruler to help correctly identify the screws



The screws length is measured from the head to the point (15 mm screw shown).

## Step 1


Attach the Side panel 2, Middle panel 3 to the Front panel 1 using 30mm bolts A and secure using the Allen Key B as detail in the diagram below.






## Step 2

Attach the Back panel 4 to the Side panel 2, middle panel 3 using 30mm bolts A and secure using the Allen Key B as detail in the diagram below.




### Step 3

Place the Top panel **5** using 30mm bolts **A** and secure using allen key **B** Then using screw **D** secure bracket **C**.




### Step 4


Attach handle to the door F using srcews and washer G. Slide Long clothes rod 6, short clothes rod 7 into the hanger. Then insert shelf pin E into the desired position and put the shelf 8.



## Step 5


Drawer handles are pre-assembled reversely. Disassemble the handle and re-attach as shown in the figure.






## Step 6

Put the assembled frame onto The Base 9. Then using 30mm bolt A and secure using allen key B as detail in the diagram below.



## Step 7

Using screw 15mm **D** and bracket **C** to hold frame with the base **9**.



### Step 8

### Fixing strap to wall.

It is recommended that the unit is fixed to a wall.

Mark fixing hole on wall.

Fasten wall strap to the wall using a suitable wall screw/plug system.



Warning: Before drilling, check wall for hidden pipes and cables.


### Step 9

### Fixing unit to wall.

With the help of another person move the unit into position.

Place the wall strap on the top of the unit.

Fasten the wall strap to the unit with screw (1) and washer (1).



Assembly is complete.

# A Guide to - Wall Mounting & Fixings

### Important note:

If plastic wall plugs are supplied with your product:



- these are only suitable for use in masonry walls.

If you are in any doubt about the correct wall plugs for your wall, seek professional advice.

Failure of the product due to using incorrect fxings is the responsibility of the installer.



Important: When drilling into walls always check that there are no hidden wires or pipes etc.

Make sure that the screws and wall plugs being used are suitable for supporting your unit. Consult a qualifed tradesperson if you are unsure.

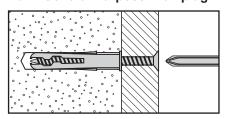
#### Hints:

- 1: General rule: (1) Always use a larger screw and wall plug if you are not sure.
- 2: Ensure you use the recommended drill bit to match the wall plug and hole size.
- 3: Ensure you drill the hole horizontally, do not force the drill or enlarge the hole.
- 4: Take extra care when drilling high walls, ceilings and ceramic tiles. Ensure wall plugs are inserted beyond the thickness of the ceramic tiles to avoid the tiles splitting or cracking.
- 5: Ensure wall plugs are well ftted and are a tight ft in the drilled hole.

### Types of walls

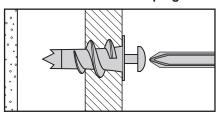
You can use one of the following types of wall plug if your walls are made of brick, breeze block, concrete, stone or wood.

### No.1 "General Purpose" wall plug



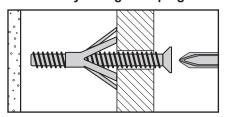
Generally aerated blocks should not be used to support heavy loads, use a specialist ftting in this case. For light loads, general purpose wall plugs can be used.

#### No.2 "Plasterboard" wall plug



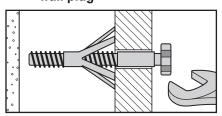
For use when attaching light loads on to plasterboard partitions.

### No.3 "Cavity Fixing" wall plug



For use with plasterboard partitions or hollow wooden doors.

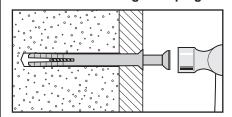
#### No.4 "Cavity Fixing-Heavy Duty" wall plug



For use when ftting or supporting heavy loads such as shelving, wall

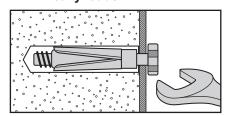
cabinets and coat racks.

### No.5 "Hammer Fixing" wall plug



For use with walls stuck with plasterboard. The hammer fxing allows it to be fxed to the wall rather than the plasterboard. Always check the fxing is secure to the retaining wall.

#### No.6 "Shield Anchor" wall plug **Heavy loads**



For use with heavier loads such as TV & HiFi speakers and satelite dishes etc.



Safety: Always check the ftting and location to ensure your safety in and around the home.

Fitting: From time to time check the ftting to ensure the wall plugs or screws do not become loose.
