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

Safety information

Important - Please read these instructions fully before installing or operating

Power source



- This symbol means that this unit is double insulated. An earth connection is not required.
- The appliance must be connected to a 100-240 volt 50/60Hz AC supply by means of a three pin socket.
- Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time - to prevent damage to this product.



 Opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltages or other hazards.



- To prevent risk of fire or electric shock, avoid overloading wall outlets, extension cords, or integral convenience receptacles.
- Use suitable power sources Plug the product into a suitable power source, as described in the operating instructions or as marked on the product.
- The supply voltage should be the same as that indicated in the technical specifications and the appliance rating plate.
- If the socket outlets in your home are not suitable for the plug supplied with this unit check with a qualified electrician for replacement.
- In order to disconnect the apparatus from the mains completely, switch off the outlet and remove the mains plug completely.



- Do not bend, stretch or pull the supply cable in order to avoid electric shock.
- When installed, the power socket must be within easy reach.
- Do not install the unit in a confined space.
 Allow adequate ventilation to prevent heat build-up.
- For indoor use only.

Moisture and water

- Do not use this apparatus near water or moisture.
- Do not use this product near a bathtub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, and laundry tub, in a wet basement, near a swimming pool, or anywhere else that water or moisture is present.

Heat sources and flames

Location of unit



- The unit must be placed on a flat stable surface and should not be subjected to vibrations.
- Do not place the unit on sloped or unstable surfaces as the unit may fall off or tip over.
- The mains socket must be located near the unit and should be easily accessible.
- This unit is designed for indoor use only.

Ventilation




- To prevent the risk of electric shock or fire hazard due to overheating, ensure that curtains and other materials do not obstruct the ventilation vents.
- Do not install or place this unit in a bookcase, built-in cabinet or in another confined space. Ensure the unit is well ventilated.
- Make sure that there is a gap of at least 10cm on both sides and a gap of 20cm at the top.

Interference

 Do not place the unit on or near appliances which may cause electromagnetic interference. If you do, it may adversely affect the operating performance of the TV, and cause a distorted picture or sound.

Socket		Description
1.	Power	Connect the mains power cable.
2.	LAN	Connect to a LAN port
3.	VGA input	Connect a PC to this input.
4.	PC Audio input	Connect audio from a PC when using the VGA video input socket.
5.	SCART input	Connect a VCR, DVD player or other AV devices with a SCART output socket.
6.	HDMI inputs	Connect to a high definition (HD) signal output device, such as a set-top box, Blu-ray disc player or AV receiver.
7.	TV Antenna input	Connect to the antenna/ aerial socket on the wall with an RF coaxial cable.
8.	Digital audio out (optical)	Connect to a digital audio socket on a 5.1 audio system.
9.	CI Slot	Connect a common interface subscription card if used.
10.	MINI AV	Connect to the composite VIDEO and AUDIO (L/R) output sockets on an external video device.



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Installing batteries in the remote

1. Press and lift the back cover to open the battery compartment of the remote control.



- 2. Insert 2 x 1.5 AAA size batteries. Make sure to match the (+) and (-) ends of the batteries with the (+) and (-) ends indicated in the battery compartment.
- **3.** Close the battery compartment cover.



Handling the batteries

- Improper or incorrect use of batteries may cause corrosion or battery leakage, which could cause fire, personal injury or damage to property.
- Only use the battery type indicated in this manual.
- When the batteries are exhausted, the remote will not function. Replace both batteries at the same time with new ones.
- Do not install new batteries with used ones and do not mix different types of batteries.
- Do not dispose of used batteries as domestic waste. Dispose of them in accordance with local regulations.




Handling the remote control

- Take care of your fingernails when pressing and holding the battery release tab.
- Do not drop or cause impact to the remote control.
- Do not spill water or any liquid on the remote control.
- Do not place the remote control on a wet object.
- Do not place the remote control under direct sunlight or near sources of excessive heat.
- Remove the batteries from the remote control when not in use for a long period of time, as it could cause corrosion or battery leakage and may result in physical injury and/ or damage of property including fire.

Remote control operation range

Point the remote control at the TV no more than 5 meters from the remote control sensor on the TV and within 60° in front of the TV. The operating distance may vary depending on the brightness of the room.



Installing the stand feet

Place the TV face down on a soft and flat surface (blanket, foam, cloth etc) to prevent damage to the TV


1. Attach the stand feet in the positions shown and secure them with the supplied screws (M4 x 12).




VESA mounting

This unit is VESA-compliant and designed to be wall mounted with a VESA-compliant 200 \times 200mm mounting kit.

Mount the unit according to the instructions of the wall bracket (not supplied)

Making the video and audio connections

Not all AV devices have the ability to connect to a TV. Please refer to the owners manual of your AV device for compatibility and connection procedures.

When connecting any external AV device, do not connect the mains cable to the mains socket until all the connections are complete.

Connecting an AV device with an HDMI cable

- This TV can accept High-Definition Multimedia Interface (HDMI) and supports HDCP (High-Bandwidth Digital Content Protection) protocol.
- The TV has a total of 3 HDMI input sockets. Please make sure the correct input source is selected corresponding to your connected HDMI input socket.
- When you connect to the output of a HD ready player (Blu-ray player, game console, set-top box or computer) switch to the HDMI function and the TV will automatically detect the resolution used by the HDMI source.
- To get the best picture quality, adjust the Blu-ray player, game console, set-top box or computer resolution up to 1920 x 1080P.



- **2.** Plug the connected device(s) into the mains socket.
- 3. Press the STANDBY button on the TV or the **ψ** button on the remote control to turn on your TV.
- 4. Press the SOURCE button on the TV or remote control to display the source list. Use the ▲▼ buttons to select HDMI 1/2/3 and then press the OK button to confirm.

Although this TV is able to connect to an HDMI device, it is possible that some devices may not operate correctly.

Connecting a computer with a VGA cable



- 1. Use a VGA cable to connect the TV's PC input socket to a computer's VGA output socket. Use an audio cable to connect the TV's PC AUDIO input socket to the computer's audio output socket.
- 2. Plug the connected devices into the mains socket.
- 3. Press the STANDBY button on the TV or the **ψ** button on the remote control to turn on your TV.
- 4. Press the SOURCE button on the TV or remote control to display the source list. Use the ▲▼ buttons to select PC and then press the OK button to confirm.



- The best resolution is 1920 x 1080
- If your computer is set to shut down after a few minutes of idle mode, the TV will also switch to standby mode due to no signal being received. This is to save energy. Press the STANDBY button on the right side of the TV when viewed from the front or the **U** button on the remote control to restart the TV.




- 1. Use a component cable to connect the TV's MINI YPbPr input sockets to an external AV devices component output sockets.
- 2. Use an AV cable to connect the TV's MINI AV input socket to the external AV device's component audio output sockets. (Audio left = white and Audio right = red).

- 3. Plug the connected devices into a mains socket.
- **4.** Press the STANDBY button on the TV or the **U** button on the remote control to turn on your TV.
- 5. Press the SOURCE button on the TV or remote control to display the source list. Use the ▲▼ buttons to select YPbPr and then press the OK button to confirm.

Connecting an AV device with a SCART cable

Rear view of TV




- Use a SCART cable to connect the TV's SCART input socket to an external AV device's SCART output socket.
- 2. Plug the connected devices into a mains socket.
- **3.** Press the STANDBY button on the TV or the **b** button on the remote control to turn on your TV.
- 4. Press the SOURCE button on the TV or remote control to display the source list. Use the ▲▼ buttons to select SCART and then press the OK button to confirm.

Connecting an AV device with a composite cable


Rear view of TV



- 1. Use an AV cable to connect the TV's MINI AV input sockets to an external AV device's composite audio/video sockets. (Video = Yellow, Audio Left = White and Audio right = red).
- 2. Plug the connected devices into a mains socket.
- 3. Press the STANDBY button on the TV or the ${f U}$ button on the remote control to turn on your TV.
- 4. Press the SOURCE button on the TV or remote control to display the source list. Use the ▲▼ buttons to select AV and then press the OK button to confirm.

Connecting a digital audio receiver

Rear view of TV



For better sound quality, you may want to play the audio through a multi-channel audio receiver.

- **1.** Use an audio cable to connect the TV's digital audio output socket to an external audio receiver's audio optical input socket.
- 2. Plug the connected devices into a mains socket.
- **3.** Press the STANDBY button on the TV or the **b** button on the remote control to turn on your TV.
- 4. Press the SOURCE button on the TV or remote control to display the source list. Use the ▲▼ buttons to select any desired input source and then press the OK button to confirm.




The TV's volume control will have no effect. You may control the audio level via the audio receiver.

Connecting headphones

Rear view of TV




Connect your headphones to the TV's headphone output socket.

Before putting the headphones on turn the volume down. Put the headphones on and slowly increase the volume until you reach a comfortable listening level.




- Listen at moderate volumes to avoid hearing damage.
- If you hear no sound during playing, do not turn up volume up as the music may suddenly begin at a high volume.
- Excessive sound pressure from earphones and headphones can cause hearing loss.
- To avoid damaging your ears, adjust the volume to the lowest safe level before playing, and turn up to the desired level when playback has started.



Simple everyday use

Turning the TV on for the first time



- **1.** Connect one end of the RF coaxial cable to the aerial socket on the wall and the other end of the cable to the aerial socket at the rear side of the TV.
- DO NOT connect the TV to the mains supply until you have completed all the connections.
- **2.** Connect the mains cable to a mains socket (after completing all other connections).
- 3. At this stage the TV will power on in standby mode (red LED indicator on the front panel). Press the STANDBY button on the TV or the 🖰 button on the remote control to turn on your TV (the red LED will change to green).
- **(**
- The STANDBY button is located on the rear right hand side of the TV.



- Always disconnect the TV from the mains socket when not in use for a long period of time.
- The STANDBY button on the rear right hand side of the TV or the $\mbox{\ensuremath{\mathfrak{O}}}$ button on the remote control is only used for switching the TV into standby. It does not disconnect the TV from the mains power. To completely disconnect the mains power, please remove the mains cable from the mains socket.

- **4.** If this is the first time you are turning on the TV and there are no programs in the TV memory, the First Time Installation menu will appear on the screen.
 - Use the \(\bigcup \bigcup \bigcup \bigcup \rightarrow \bigcup \alpha \rightarrow \navigation buttons to enter the settings, select the 'auto tuning' option and press the OK button to begin the setup process.

Simple everyday use

Selecting the input source



- 1. Press the SOURCE button on the TV or the remote control to display the input source list.
- 2. Press the V buttons to select the input source you require: DTV, ATV, COMPOSITE-AV, SCART, PC-VGA, YPBPR, HDMI1, HDMI2 or HDMI3.
- **3.** Press the OK button to confirm your selection.



• In DTV mode, press the RADIO button to switch to TV/Digital radio channels directly.

Channel selection

 Press the CH+/- buttons on the TV or remote control repeatedly; or use the 0-9 buttons on the remote control to select a channel.



Alternative:

Press the OK button to enter the channel list. Then use the

Then use the

buttons to highlight and select the channel.

Press the OK button to view the selected channel.

- A blocked channel will display 'CH BLOCKED' on-screen. Press the 'INFO' button to enter the passcode. (refer to page 31 for details on LOCK).
- Press the \bigcirc button to return to the previously viewed channel.

Display channel information

• Press the & INFO button to view the current information

Volume adjustment

- Press the VOL+/- buttons on the TV or remote control to adjust the volume.
- If you wish to switch the sound off, press the MUTE button on the remote control. Press the MUTE button once more or the VOL+/- buttons to resume the audio.

Using the Electronic Program Guide

Open the guide by pressing the EPG button on the remote.



The program guide displays a list of 8 channels along with the program schedule for the next 8 programmes.

The current channel marker is highlighted with a green block. The selected day/ date is listed along the top left.

- Pressing the V button repeatedly so that the highlight marker proceeds past the displayed 8 programmes will load the next set of programs.

Along the bottom left of the guide is a key showing the usage of the colour buttons found on the remote control.

Simple everyday use

PVR recording

NOTE: This function is only available with a compatible USB device connected.

Before you can record anything you will need to connect a USB device with space free for recordings.

If the device is not readible, slow or needs erasing see PVR file system on page 37.

Recording a current show

- **1.** Connect a USB device to one of the USB ports on the side of the TV.
- 2. To record a TV show currently airing press the REC button on the remote control to display the record menu and begin recording the current channel.



To stop the recording at any time press the 'REC' button once more to display the interface and select the STOP button using the ► buttons. You will be asked if you wish to stop the PVR?; press the ► button to select YES. The recording will then stop.


Recording a future show

- 1. Connect a USB device to one of the USB ports on the side of the TV.
- 2. Press the EPG button on the remote to display the programme guide.
- 3. Use the ◀▶▲▼ buttons to locate a programme you wish to record.
- **4.** Press the RED button on the remote to display the recording options.
- 5. Use the ◀▶▲▼ buttons to make adjustments.

Generally you really only need to adjust the recording frequency from Once, Daily or Weekly.

6. Press the OK button on the remote to schedule the recording.


PVR schedule list



- 1. Press the EVENT LIST button on the remote control to display your scheduled recordings.
- **2.** Select and press the GREEN button to edit the record settings.
- **3.** Select and press the RED button to delete a scheduled recording.

Simple everyday use

Picture settings



Adjust to set your preferred picture mode.

- 1. Press the MENU button, then use the ◀▶ buttons to select the PICTURE menu.
- 2. Press the OK button, then use the ▲ ▼ buttons to select the following picture options. Press OK to confirm.
- **3.** Press the MENU button to return to a previous menu.

Picture mode

Press the ◀▶ buttons to cycle through the picture modes: Dynamic, Standard, Movie, Game, PC, Cinema 24p & Personal. Press the OK button to confirm.



, Alternative:

Press the PICTURE button once and then use the \blacktriangleleft buttons to select the picture mode directly.

Contrast

Use the \triangleleft buttons to adjust the difference between light and dark levels in the picture.

Brightness

Use the buttons to increase or decrease the amount of white in the picture (user mode only).

Colour

Use the buttons to increase or decrease the colour saturation.

Sharpness

Use the \triangleleft buttons to adjust the level of crispness in the edges between light and dark areas of the picture (User mode only).

Colour temperature

Use the ◀▶ buttons to cycle through the colour temperature options: Normal, Cold or Warm. Press the OK button to confirm.

Aspect ratio

Use the ◀▶ buttons to cycle through the aspect ratio settings: 4:3, 16:9, Auto, Zoom 1 and Zoom 2. Press the OK button to confirm.

Press the PICTURE button twice and then use the buttons to select the aspect ratio directly.

Expert Settings>

Noise reduction

Use the ◀▶ buttons to adjust the picture noise reduction level from: Off, Low Middle and High. Press the MENU button to confirm.



Sound settings



Adjust to your preferred audio enhancement.

- 1. Press the MENU button, then use the ◀▶ buttons to select the SOUND menu.
- 2. Press the OK button, then use the ▲ ▼ buttons to select the following sound options. Press OK to confirm.
- **3.** Press the MENU button to return to a previous menu.

Sound mode

Press the $\blacktriangleleft \triangleright$ buttons to cycle through the audio enhancement modes: Standard, Music, Movie, News and Personal. Press the OK button to confirm.



Alternative:

Press the SOUND button once and then use the \blacktriangleleft buttons to select the sound mode directly.

Treble

Use the ◀▶ buttons to increase or decrease the treble level (user mode only)

Bass

Use the ◀▶ buttons to increase or decrease the bass level (user mode only)

Balance

Use the **\Delta** buttons to adjust the relative volume of the speakers in a multi speaker system.

Auto volume level

This feature automatically adjusts the audio level when the TV is turned ON. The function is activated by selecting ON.

Digital output mode

Select the digital mode when using a DIGITAL OPTICAL cable to a digital audio receiver. Select from PCM, AUTO and OFF.

Audio description

Enable the audio description function by selecting ON.

AD volume


Adjust the volume level of the audio description function.

Audio language

Select your preferred language.

Channel settings



Allows you to set up a variety of channel options.


- Press the MENU button and then use the buttons to select the CHANNEL menu.
- 2. Press the OK button and use the ▲ ▼ buttons to select any of the following channel options. Press OK to confirm.

Auto tuning



- 1. Use the ▲ ▼ buttons to select AUTO TUNING then press the OK button to confirm.
- 2. Use the the ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ buttons to choose a tuning mode and country. Then select 'Auto tuning' and press the OK button to begin tuning.
- Press the MENU button to return back to the main menu

Analogue manual tuning



Search analogue channels by entering parameters manually.

- 2. The options are as follows:

Storage to 1	Use the buttons to change the numbered location of the found channel.
Sound system	Select the sound system BG / DK / I / L / L'.
Current channel	Displays the current channel number.
Search	Use the ◀▶ buttons to start the manual tuning.
Fine-tune	Use the buttons to make fine manual adjustments to the tuning.

DVB-T manual tuning



How to search digital channels manually.

- 1. Use the ▲ ▼ buttons to select DVB-T MANUAL TUNING then press the OK button to confirm.
- 2. Select a channel number by pressing the ▶ button or by using the number buttons on the remote control. The strength and quality of the signal indication bars are below.
- **3.** Select OK to begin the search.
- 4. To exit, press the MENU button.

Channel edit



Use the ▲ ▼ buttons to select CHANNEL EDIT.
 Press the OK or ▶ button to enter the menu. Use the ▲ ▼ buttons to navigate through the menu.

Delete

 Press the RED button to delete the highlighted channel.

To restore the deleted channels, run an auto scan.

• Press the MENU button to return to the main menu.

Move

- Use the ▲ ▼ buttons to select the channel; press the YELLOW button to enter move mode (the channel is highlighted in red). Use the ▲ ▼ buttons to move the channel location. Press the YELLOW button once more to confirm.
- Press the MENU button to return to the main menu.

Skip

• Use the ▲ ▼ buttons to select the channel; press the BLUE button to assign the skip function. Press once more to remove the skip function.

Skip

- Use the ▲ ▼ buttons to select the channel you wish to skip.
- Press the BLUE button; a logo will appear next to the channel name and the channel will be skipped when you scroll through the channels.
- Press the BLUE button once more on the highlighted channel to disable the skip function.
- Press the MENU button to return to the main menu.

Signal information

Only available in DTV mode. Signal information includes: Channel, network Modulation, Quality and Strength info.

CI information

When a CI module is inserted this function displays the relevant information.

Rear view of TV




- Switch OFF the TV before connecting an USB storage device.
- **2.** Connect your USB storage device to one of the USB ports on the side of the TV.



Care & maintenance

After using the TV

Set to Standby.

Switch the unit off at the mains and unplug it if you are leaving it unattended for a long period (holidays etc).

Avoid leaving the batteries fitted in the remote control if you leave the unit unattended for long periods. They may leak and damage the remote control.

Care & cleaning

All care and cleaning operations should be carried out with the unit unplugged from the mains power.

Use a soft dry cloth to wipe away dust from the screen and surface.

If the surfaces are extremely dirty, clean the TV with a cloth which has been dipped in weak soapy water. Wring the cloth until it is almost dry, then use it to wipe the TV.

Ensure there is no excess water on the screen. Allow any water or dampness to evaporate before switching the TV on.



NEVER use alcohol, benzine, pain-thinner, cleaning fluid or other chemicals. Do not use compressed air to remove dust.



Troubleshooting

The TV does not respond when pressing any buttons.

• The TV may freeze up during use. Disconnect the mains cable from the mains socket for a few minutes. Reconnect the mains cable and try to operate as usual.

The TV cannot be switched on.

- Check the TV is connected to the mains supply.
- Make sure all connected AV devices are switched off before switching on your TV.

The remote control does not work.

- Check to see if there are any objects between the TV and the remote control causing an obstruction. Ensure that you are pointing the remote control directly at the TV.
- Ensure that the batteries are installed correctly with the polarity (+ to + and to -).
- Install new batteries

Power is suddenly turned off.

- Check the power of the TV. The mains supply may be interrupted.
- Check if the sleep timer is set.
- · Check whether the auto standby has activated.

Video problems

No picture or sound.

- Check whether the TV is switched on.
- Try another channel. The problem may be caused by the broadcaster.

Picture appears slowly after switching on.

 This is normal. The image is muted during the TV start-up process. Please contact your technical assistance if the picture has not appeared after 5 minutes.

None or poor colour/ Poor picture.

- Adjust the settings in the PICTURE menu.
- Try another channel. The problem may be caused by the broadcaster.

Horizontal / Vertical bar or picture shaking.

Check for local interference such as an electrical appliance or power tool.

Poor reception on some channels.

- Station of cable channel may be experiencing problems, tune to another station.

Lines or streaks in pictures.

Audio problems

No output from one of the speakers.

Unusual sound from inside the TV.

• A change in ambient humidity or temperature may result in an unusual noise when the TV is switched on or off and does not indicate a fault with the TV.

No sound when connecting HDMI.

• Check is the input source is HDMI.

Audio noise.

• Keep the RF coaxial cable away from other connected cables.

- Check the signal cable.

Frequently asked questions

Why have I lost some/ all of my channels?

• It happens sometimes If you have a weak signal. Usually it just means you'll need to re-scan your digital box or TV. Do not worry, it is easy to do. And once you've done it, you should get all the Freeview channels available to you. If the problem persists, you may need to get your aerial checked. Talk to technical support or contact your local aerial installer.

Why do I get 'blocking' on my digital picture?

- In most cases, blocking is cause by a reception problem either the signal is too weak or here is some kind of interference. Talk to technical support or contact your local aerial installer.
- Blocking can also be caused by a digital signal that is too strong. If you are still experiencing blocking and the signal is strong, consult your local aerial installer for advice.

Can I watch Freeview using a portable set-top aerial?

- Some, but only a few, homes may be able to use a set top aerial. However, for a much better reception, we strongly recommend that you use a rooftop aerial.
- If you do not have access to a rooftop aerial for example, if you live in a flat and the aerial is the responsibility of your landlord, or if you're using a second TV in the bedroom and don't want the hassle and expense of using extension cables, a set-top aerial may be your only option.

What type of aerial do I need?

- If you are installing a new aerial, we recommend a wideband rooftop aerial rather than a loft aerial. Loft aerials generally receive a weaker signal and are more likely to get interference from other electrical devices in the home. We suggest you have an aerial survey done before getting an aerial upgrade.
- Talk to your local aerial installer.
